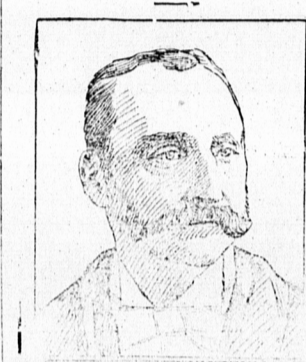

—Branch 215, C. M. B. A. Summerside, celebrated its anniversary by a very enjoyable social and dance in their hall on Wednesday last.

—The S. S. Dageid of Montreal arrived in Summerside, yesterday with a large freight. She leaves again today taking from Summerside about 2500 bags of oats and potatoes for the Newfoundland market.

—A special train will leave Summerside at four o'clock p.m. today, giving the people a chance to attend the Grand Opera in Charlottetown. The train leaves on return to Summerside right after the opera.

—The town of Summerside has completed arrangements for the sale of their entire issue of ninety thousand dollar water and Sewerage fund, to the Dominion Securities Company of Montreal. The price realized was about 103.

—The schooner Malabar, which came to Summerside with a cargo of cedar posts from Gaspe, has finished discharging and is now being loaded with a general cargo consisting of hard coal, hay, oats, butter etc., for Barthurst, N. B.

—The local campaign opened in Summerside last night with a big Liberal Rally held by the Young Liberal Club of Summerside in their Club room, Ludlow Hall, which was largely attended. The principal speakers were J. W. Richards; Capt. Joseph Read; Dr. Jardine, candidate for the fifth district; J. H. Bell and others.

—The death occurred Sunday the 25th inst at Freehold, Lot 11, of Mrs. James Henderson. Deceased who was about eighty four years of age had been in her usual health until about ten days ago; when, by an unfortunate accident she took a drink of concentrated lye, in mistake for some cordial. Medical aid was summoned at once but despite all that could be done she gradually failed until the end came. Her husband and several sons and daughters survive her namely William T., Perminus and Joshua in Boston, and Mrs. Samuel Ramsay, Tynes Valley; Mrs. Peter Millar, Bidford; Mrs. Wm. Milligan, Waltham, Mass.; Mrs. Joseph Shair, Boston; Mrs. Arthur MacKay, Charlottetown; Mrs. Fred Williams, Poplar Grove; and Mrs. Donald Ramsay, Freehold. The funeral which took place on Tuesday the twenty-seventh was very largely attended.

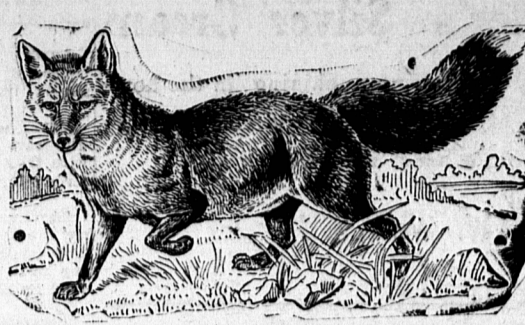
