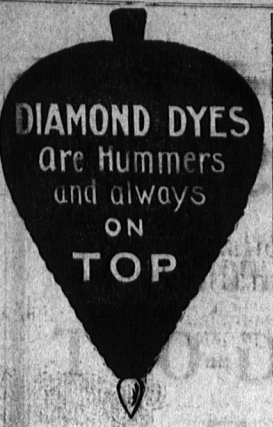

MARK GUY PEARSE SCORES AUDIENCES Says He Will Not Make a Second Lecture Tour of America - Audiences Are Rude, He Says.

CHARLOTTETOWN, July 29. - "Nothing in the world could ever induce me to come on another summer lecture tour to America," remarked Dr. Mark Guy Pearse of London to the correspondent yesterday. "It isn't that I have not been treated well by the people I have met in the hotels and about the grounds at the various assemblies, because your people are almost always kind, courteous, genial, wholesome," he continued. "But your audiences they give me the nightmare in England, no matter how rough the audience, the speaker is always treated respectfully. And the Englishman's idea of what constitutes treating a speaker respectfully consists in coming on time, paying attention, and remaining to the close of the lecture. At these summer audiences at the Chataqua, every person thinks he is a law unto himself. "He, or it's usually a she, thinks that he can come into a lecture whenever he pleases, read a newspaper or do basketry, or write letters as much as is desired, and walk towardly when the spirit moves, stalk across the auditorium to greet a friend whom he has not seen for a year or a day, or walk noisily out of the auditorium at any time, no matter whether the speaker is praying or reading poetry or working to a fine oratorical climax. "It's disconcerting; your audiences are rude; they ought to learn manners, and for one on a through with them. I don't come over again, much as I have enjoyed meeting your people. But no more lecture courses at summer assemblies for me!"

DIFFERENT ICE IN THE STRAITS.

In the House of Commons a few days ago, Mr. Prentiss said: - "There is no doubt that the conditions in the Straits of Northumberland are not all the same as those in the waters of the Baltic Sea. The 'Erma' was the first experiment made by Russia ten years ago. That vessel cost over \$1,000,000, and she was not at all a success. Two years after she was built she had to be remodelled at a cost of nearly half a million dollars. She has been breaking large sheets of ice of four or five feet thickness, not fine ice such as we have in the Straits of Northumberland. The certain winds prevail at some seasons of the year which make it impossible for a steamer to go through the ice properly. No steamer in the world could be built strong enough to go through the piles which accumulate at certain points. But we think steamers can be built to go through the crevasse, which will open through a thick bank of ice. All these matters are being studied, and we are gathering information everywhere that ice breakers are in use with the expectation that we shall be able to provide a steamer that will give satisfaction."
