5 tablespoons shortening
1 cup brown sugar, lightly packed
2 eggs, well beaten
1/2 cup milk
1 tablespoon melted butter
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
Measure and sift together the flour, baking powder and salt; mix in farina.

Cream the shortening and gradually blend in 1/2 cup of the brown sugar. Add the eggs and combine well.
Add the dry ingredients alternately with the milk to the creamed mixture; mix well.
Turn into greased and lightly floured 8-inch square cake pan. Brush top with melted butter and sprinkle with a mixture of remaining 1/4 cup sugar and cinnamon.
Bake in a moderately hot oven, 375 degrees, 35 minutes.
