COUNTY BOUNDARIES.

THE GUARDIAN has commended the Mills Bill for redistributing the Commors seats so far as it lays down the principle of restoring and adhering to the county boundaries for electoral divisions.

It is true that Sir John Macdonald cut up and gerrymandered the counties of Ontario in 1882 and 1892, but ten years before the first of these dates, in introducing the first general redistribution bill in 1872, he laid down and strongly enforced the desirability of adhering to county boundaries.

It is desired as much as possible to keep the representation within the county, so that each county that is a municipality of Ontario should be represented, and if it becomes large enough, that it should be divided into ridings.

But it is obvious that there is a great advantage in having counties elect men whom they know. Our municipal system gives an admirable opportunity to constituencies to select men for their deserts.

All that great advantage is lost by cutting off a portion of two several counties and adding them together for electoral purposes only. These portions so cut off have no common interest, they do not meet together, and they have no common feeling except that once in five years they go to the polls in their own township to vote for a man who may be known in one section and not in another.

At length, after a trial and a conviction based on perjured and forged testimony, and after suffering incredible hardships in solitary confinement in the poisonous climate of Devils'

Island, the prisoner Dreyfus is to be brought home to have a new trial. It is almost miraculous that the poor fellow is alive. And now when he returns he is not to be permitted a trial in the civil courts.

The British Columbia Legislature at its last session passed very stringent legislation to prevent Japanese immigration to that Province. It lies within the power of the Governor General in Council at Ottawa to disallow this, or any other act passed by a provincial legislature.

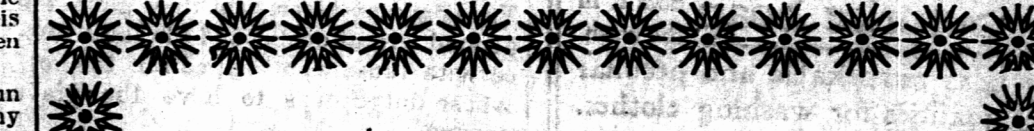
