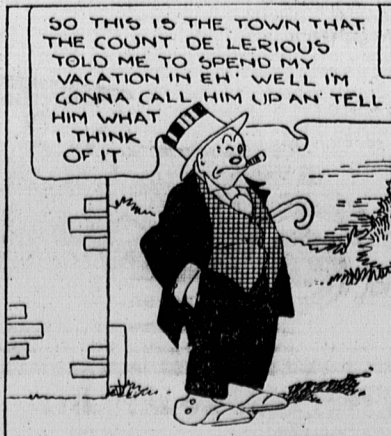

Ferguson placed in power, the increased number of Conservatives elected to the Quebec legislature, the very near defeat of the Liberal Government of British Columbia, and the Halifax and N. B. by-elections which returned Conservatives to the Federal House; these with reports from all parts of the country plainly indicate that the Conservatives under the Right Hon. Arthur Meighen will soon as the people have the chance, conduct the Government of Canada into the wider and greater prosperity that awaits us.

Continuing his discourse Dr. Tolmie spoke along the lines of successful organization filled with illustrations of methods pursued in other provinces. These he spoke of in detail for the information of Conservative workers. His address which lasted about an hour was well illustrated by incidents coming under his official knowledge and with many laughter producing humorous incidents. He closed with predictions of a big Conservative victory at the election which may come very soon for despite Mr. King's statement the by-elections may force it upon him, and then our great leader the Right Hon. Arthur Meighen will be restored by the people of Canada to his proper place in the Government of the country. His splendid address was listened to with rapt attention and thanking his hearers he closed amidst loud and prolonged applause.

Mr. James McIsaac on invitation from the chair spoke briefly in review of Dominion matters having particular reference to their so-called economies and how they practiced it. He spoke in his usual convincing way but the hour being late he did not undertake a long address. His speech was to the point and heartily applauded. After three cheers and a tiger for Premier Stewart, and the same for the Hon. Dr. Tolmie the meeting closed singing the National Anthem.

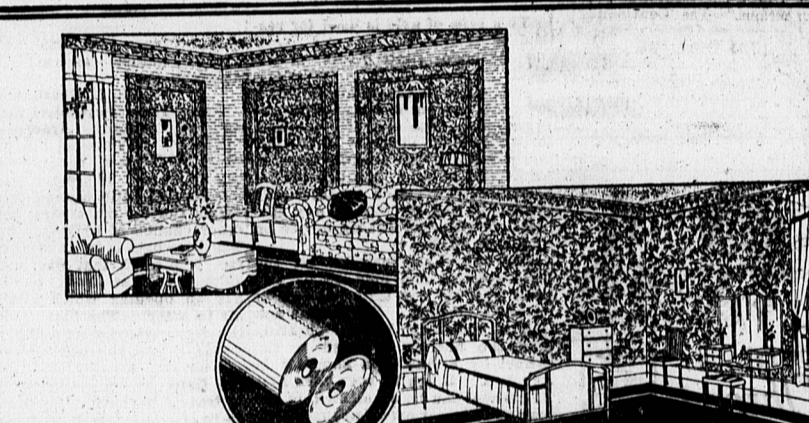
