THEORIST AND HIS THEORIES.

We honestly think that the space given up to the long letter of Theorist, which appears in another column of this issue, might have been better filled. His letter, so far as it attempts to deal with The Guardian's position, is wholly based upon a perversion of our words and meaning. We did not say that "profitable pork production has already about reached its limit in this Province." On the contrary we said that "pork production can be increased, can be increased considerably, but the added quantity could not be produced at the same cost per pound as that which is at present grown and marketed." Nor did we, as Theorist says, "claim that merchantable oats and potatoes cannot be profitably fed to hogs, even at present prices." Whether this journal has, as Theorist avers, "practically advised those engaged in farming to continue in the old rut," we may leave our thousands of readers to answer. But what shall be thought of the honesty and fairness of a writer who takes his argument almost wholly upon such monstrous perversions as those above referred to?

This is not the first time we have met a "theorist" who affects to know a great deal about every other calling than that by which he gains his daily bread one who can teach the farmer to farm, the editor how to conduct a newspaper, the minister to cure the souls and the doctor to heal the bodies of men. We have, however frequently met more courteous disputants of the theorist class, and not infrequently those who disclosed a fuller knowledge of the facts pertaining to the subjects they undertook to discuss. To do him justice, Theorist does not profess to have had any experience in pork-raising. Why then does he enter the lists and attempt to convert the facts and experiences of a prominent and successful pork-producer as cited in this journal? Of facts he has disclosed none, of practical knowledge of the subject none, of experience none. What remains but the too apparent self-conceit which smirks in every line of his long-drawn epistle?

It was well enough for Theorist, who has apparently heard of, if not heard the wise teaching of Professor Robertson, to give a word of praise to the Professor and the dairy industry, the value of barnyard manure and the necessity of returning to the soil the fertility which the crops have abstracted but these are not new ideas to our intelligent and practical farmers. What Theorist calls with tautological emphasis a "new gospel," has already some flavor of age to the men of the farm and the stockyard. But we could pardon our correspondent for using a few platitudes and, like the katydid, "saying these undisputed things in such a solemn way," if only he would have the grace to quote honestly the words and arguments he seeks to refute and not attempt to batter down a solid wall of fact and logic with the pith balls of assumption and empty declamation. That the intelligent stockraiser whom we quoted ten days ago has not been answered by Theorist will be apparent to every reader. The farmer knew what he was talking about. Theorist only thinks he knows, and not many of his readers will be of the same way of thinking.
