Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

The sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alone side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after issuing homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

SENTENCES ON FRENCH PRISONERS IN GERMANY POSTPONED

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
BERLIN, Aug. 28.—(By wireless from Sayville)—The following official statement was issued here today:

The German Emperor has ordered postponement until after the war of the execution of all sentences imposed for the punishment of French prisoners, both civilian and military, on accounts of acts committed to Sept. 1 of this year.

The Overseas News Agency adds: "The newspapers state that this action was taken as a result of a reciprocal agreement with the French Government."

The Imperial order providing for postponement of sentences on prisoners also provides for the immediate release of such persons from confinement and their return to the prison camp at Cottbus.

ROBERT H. DUVAR NOT KILLED BUT WOUNDED

Mr. E. Hunter Duvar, Mill River, received the pleasant news yesterday that his son Robert H. Duvar who was reported killed some days ago, is still alive. Private Duvar in a letter dated August 8th to his father reports that he has been wounded and is now in a hospital at Calais, France.

Piano Typewriter Latest Invention

LONDON, Aug. 28.—The Daily Express says that Herman Darewski will shortly introduce to England the "most wonderful invention in the world of the musical mechanics since the coming of the automatic piano player." It is a piano typewriter which reproduces in ordinary musical notation whatever the performer plays. A pianist can make a copy of any piece of music by merely playing it through. By the insertion of carbon papers half a dozen copies may be made in one operation, as with an ordinary typewriter. The inventor is an Italian.

OFFICER WRITES OF ISLAND SOLDIER'S DEATH

The following letter speaks for itself:

Belgium July 4 1916
Mrs. H. J. McKinnon,
Charlottetown, P. E. I.

Dear Madam: It is with the greatest regret that I have to write you particulars of the death of Lance-Corporal Jerome Gallant, killed in action on June 16th, official notice of which you have no doubt already received. There is little I can say to you that can mitigate your loss, yet it will be a great consolation to know that he died bravely doing his duty in a manner reflecting great credit on himself, his family and his country.

He was given a soldier's burial, the best circumstances permitted, close to where he fell beside many others
