Facing Both Ways

TORONTO, March 8.—Canada is well represented at the joint conference of the General Council of Presbyterian and Reformed Churches in America, and the American section of the Alliance of Reformed Churches throughout the World, being held in Atlantic City and which today gives ratification to a merger of the two bodies into one organization, to be known as the American Section of the Alliance of Reformed Churches Throughout the World Holding the Presbyterian System.

Rev. Ephraim Scott, D.D., Montreal, Moderator of the Presbyterian Church in Canada; Rev. Stuart C. Parker, Toronto; Rev. A. J. MacGillivray, of Guelph; Rev. J. G. Potter, Montreal; Rev. Frank Baird of Picton, N.S., and Thos. McMillan, Toronto, represent the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

The United Church of Canada is represented by Rev. G. C. Pidgeon, D.D., Moderator of the United Church; Principal Gandier, by Rev. Clarence McKinnon, D.D., Halifax; Rev. Jas. Endicott, Rev. W. T. Gunn, Chancellor Bowles, Rev. R. P. MacKay, D.D., Rev. J. H. Edmison, D.D., Toronto, and Rev. G. D. Kilpatrick Ottawa.

The United Church of Canada has also had its application to enter the Ecumenical Methodist Conference endorsed by the Western Section of that body. A communication has been received from Rev. H. K. Carroll, Plainfield, N. J. secretary of the Ecumenical Methodist Conference, Western Section, announcing the endorsement of the application of the United Church to become a member of world wide Methodism, the resolution adopted by the meeting of the Western Section reading as follows:

"This meeting, recognizing that while the United Church of Canada is not entirely Methodist in all its marks and characteristics hereby endorses without dissent the request of the United Church of Canada that it be recognized as a member of the Ecumenical Methodist Conference and of its committee."
