NO LIVES LOST AND CATTLE SAFE

VICTORIA, June 16.—Two thousand five hundred acres of the richest delta agricultural land in British Columbia, planted with berries, fruits and other crops, have been inundated and about 35 settlers, mostly returned soldiers, driven off by the floods when the Nicomen Island dykes gave way before the record height of water and allowed the Fraser River to pour in.

Colonel R. D. Davies, chairman of the Land Settlement Board, returned today after assisting the flight of the settlers against the floods. No lives were lost when the dyke broke. Cattle on the island were driven to some of the high spots where they are safe above the water line. "The settlers got together and worked for five days and nights to hold the dykes against the flooding Fraser," said Colonel Davies. "But the water this year is the highest it has ever been since 1903. It is the highest water that has ever been held by the dykes."

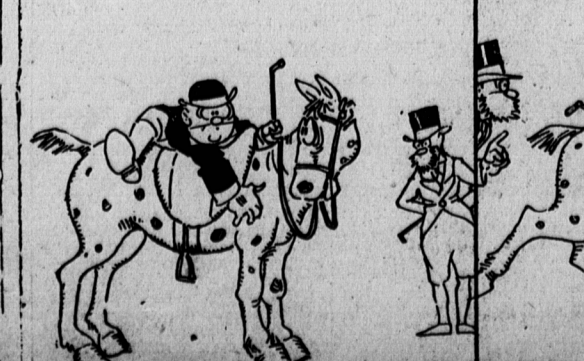

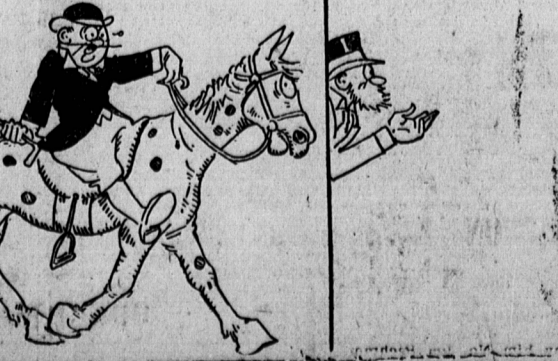
