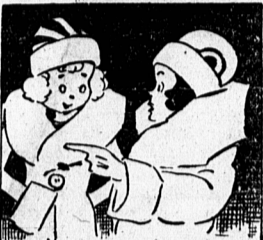

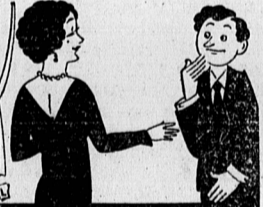

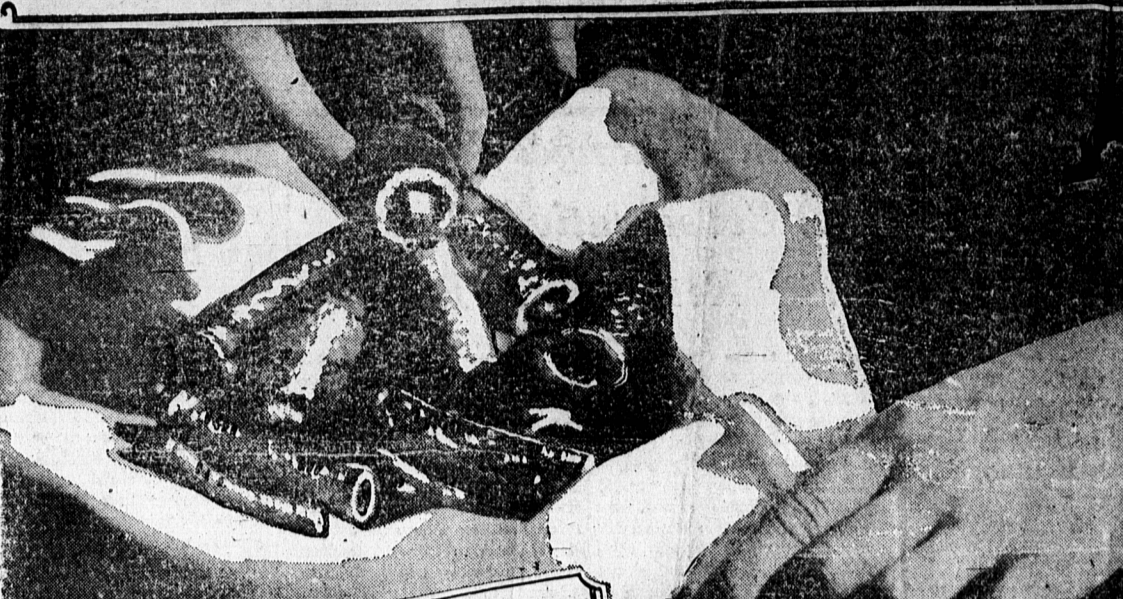
With the aid of cedar kindlings carried on the sled, he soon had a fire under the teakettle.
