NEW YORK, Jan. 6. — Dan Skilling, Chairman of the Sam Langford Benefit Fund, yesterday announced that arrangements had been completed for the holding of a benefit boxing show, the proceeds to go toward helping the blind and destitute boxer who was the hero of many a thrilling battle in the years gone by. It will be held on Jan. 19.

"The Walker Sporting Club through Eddie Koven, promoter, has donated the use of its club house in Harlem for the show," said Skilling, "and Tex Rickard has donated the use of the new Madison Square Garden box offices and ticket selling force for the handling of the ticket sales. The sale will open Wednesday morning and the prices will range from \$1 to \$5.

"We have arranged forty rounds of boxing in which stars will appear. Bruce Flowers will meet Johnny Ryan and Jack McVey will take on Young Jack Dempsey of Philadelphia; Eddie Anderson tangles Joe Souza, all in ten-round bouts, while Black Bill boxes Mique Parra in a six, and Canada Lee meets Izzy Groves in a four-round bout."

NEW YORK OBYS NEW CURFEW LAW

NEW YORK, Jan. 6. —A strange stillness descended upon the night city area of the city at 2 o'clock this morning. In place of the New Year celebration revelry that extended the dawn of the previous morning there was Sunday morning peace and quiet.

There was nothing strange in the reason for this sudden somnolence. It was to be noted in the fact that the 3 a. m. curfew law went into effect for the first time and that to all outward appearance, the night clubs obeyed it promptly. And their obedience was not brought about by any action of the police, for no special patrols were sent out to see that the curfew was taken seriously by the club proprietors. The policemen on post were instructed to keep a close watch to determine if any place kept open beyond the legal hour. But not one such complaint was turned in, and in no case did a policeman assist the shutting down.

BIGGEST DRUG TRAFFICKING RING ON NORTH AMERICAN CONTINENT ALLEGED

MONTREAL, Jan. 6. —Judge Monet in police court here today set bail at \$10,000 for every one of the five men—Joseph H. Farley, Sam Reed, Charles S. Gally, Fred Monahan and J. Edwards—who were arrested here last week in connection with what the police claim is the biggest drug trafficking ring on the North American continent. The men will appear for arraignment on January 7th. Francis W. Cowan, chief of the narcotic division of the Federal Department of Health, today told newspapermen he had learned that in the last three years orders had been given and executed by a single concern for the manufacture of 31,500 boxes to contain 50,000 ounces of illicit drugs, valued at \$1,000,000 wholesale.

Hon. Vincent Massey Visits New York

(Canadian Press.) WASHINGTON, Jan. 6. —Hon. Vincent Massey, newly appointed Minister from Canada to the United States, was in Washington on a flying visit today. He arrived this morning, remained two or three hours and departed for Canada. It was announced he was here on private business. A little later he will come to locate offices and make other preliminary arrangements. He is expected to come to Washington permanently about the first of coming month.

"DRY" CITY'S NAME MEANS "GOOD WATER"

CANBERRA, Australia, Jan. 6. —Canberra, the District of Columbia of Australia, which is "dry", is pronounced by the natives as can-berra, and in the aboriginal language means "good water" of which there is an abundance in wells built before the coming of the white man. Canberra, where parliament will soon be opened in its new home by the Duke of York, is known as the "bush" capital, because of its location, and Yarralumla House, an old fashioned "bush" homestead has been converted into the viceregal residence for the Duke and Duchess of York during their visit here.

GRAMMER SCHOOL HAS MINIATURE HOSPITAL

SAVANNAH, Cal. Jan. 6. —General A. H. Grammer, Spring afternoon, clock standing still. Up goes a small hand. Lips murmur, "teacher can I go home, I'm sick." Remember? Nothing like that happens in the Oildale grammar school. A miniature hospital containing a bed, first aid chest, sanitary table and medicine cabinet, including castor oil, is maintained by the teachers and pupils.

An average of six children a day are treated in the hospital. Girl pupils are appointed to act as nurses. Health charts on each student are maintained and those who are under-nourished or under-weight receive special attention from a physician.

GLADSTONE'S DAUGHTER IS DEAD IN ENGLAND

LONDON, Jan. 6. —Mrs. Mary Drew, second daughter of the great Liberal statesman, William Ewart Gladstone, died at Hawarden Castle Saturday night, in her eightieth year. For many years she held the highest esteem in world politics and literature, took the keenest interest in her father's work, and acted as his secretary until his death.

French Official His Own Chambermaid

PARIS, Jan. 6.—A cabinet minister in his nightshirt, making his own bed and shaking rugs out of the window, was the visual treat afforded pedestrians in the boulevard St. Michel one morning. Louis Marin, minister of pensions and deputy from the Nancy region, was deserted without notice by his chambermaid. And his Excellency is very particular about keeping his house in good order.

Not so particular about his own garb, Marin usually wears a "var-use" or blouse similar to those of workmen, his neck adorned with an old-fashioned flowing blue bow tie, studded with white polka dots. His shoes are sturdy things made more for the mud of his native Lorraine than for the boulevards of Paris. Monsieur Marin would rather walk than ride any day.

"I have a government credit of 25,000 francs a year for the upkeep of an automobile," he said. "But I have no car; first, because it is healthier to walk; second, because it helps the government economy. When I really have to attend an important ceremony, I simply hire a classy car for an hour or a day."

Hydrogen Regaining Favor As Balloon Gas

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—Helium one of the youngest members of a large family of gases, but very useful to Uncle Sam because it lifts balloons, is looking to its laurels. Hydrogen, an older brother, is returning to favor.

Because of its high inflammability, hydrogen lost a quality to be desired which helium was subsequently found to possess. Helium, however, was exceedingly rare as opposed to the abundance of its rival, and it was expensive to manufacture.

Recently the experience of a British dirigible visited by lightning during a storm led to the conclusion that hydrogen was more to be respected than disdained. If they could eliminate an additional hazard that of the combustible fumes generated by the gasoline motors, engineers believe they re-establish hydrogen as premier for gas-bag inflation. Development of an engine utilizing crude oil for fuel has monopolized their efforts.
