Tignish Born Nun Dies At Halifax (By The Canadian Press) HALIFAX, Feb. 17 - Sister Mary Francisca, a member of the Sisters of Charity for 76 years and a native of Tignish, P.E.I., died at St. Joseph's Convent here today. She was 94. Sister Francisca joined the order here in 1873 and returned to Halifax in 1940 after serving in convents at Ampror, Ont., Boston, Bathurst, N. B., and Meteghan, Glace Bay, New Waterford and North Sydney, N.S. Funeral services will be held here Thursday. Two nieces, Sister Carmelita and Sister Rose Celestine now are members of the order at Roxbury, Mass., and Glace Bay.

Portia White To Be Heard In S'ide Thursday Portia White, brilliant young Canadian Contralto who will appear at the Summerside High School Auditorium this Thursday evening is the first Canadian singer to be officially sponsored. Leading citizens of Halifax and important provincial officials of Nova Scotia, were so enthusiastic about the Nova Scotia born and trained singer that they established a Portia White Trust to enable her to pursue her studies and to further her career.

While she was in high school, Miss White won a scholarship at the Halifax Conservatory of Music. As this scholarship applied only to her voice lessons, she supplemented her income by teaching at a primary school. Still in her twenties, the gifted young contralto has been compared with the late Sigrd Onegin, world-famous Swedish singer. College-trained, imbued with the finest musical traditions, Miss White is a charming, cultured woman. The sincerity of her musicianship and the glowing, deep tones of her beautiful voice have placed Miss White in the front rank of contemporary singers.

Monthly Meeting Of Summerside Town Council His Worship Mayor J. F. Arnett presided at the regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council last evening when the only Councillors present were Henry Wedge, H. B. Schurman, and L. J. Gorrill. On the recommendation of the Fire Department the following officials were reappointed for another year: Chief, W. B. McNeill; Deputy Chief, C. T. C. Kenny; secretary, George Hogg; Mr. T. E. Hickey, C.A., was appointed auditor for the coming year. The Clerk reported that two strens had been obtained from the Department of Reconstruction and would be set up in the West Ward as additional fire alarms. A budget, submitted by the

Board of School Trustees, for 1948 indicated that they would need \$26,000 for expenses and over \$2,000 for capital expenditure. The report also stated that the Board was considering employing a domestic science teacher. Mayor Arnett said that these requests would be dealt with when the town budget was drawn up. Councillor Wedge reporting for the Streets Committee said that the new thaw had left the streets in poor condition but there is nothing that can be done except keep the drains open. He said that the biggest expense in snow fighting is on the outskirts of town, particularly Central Street North. If conditions are as bad next year he did not think that the present equipment would be sufficient and he suggested that a tractor plow be purchased next fall. When the meeting opened Mayor Arnett congratulated Councillors Gorrill and Wedge on their

re-election and the Councillors present extended their congratulations to the Mayor on his re-election.
