The funeral of the late Captain McKinnon, of Summerside, which took place there on Friday morning was one of the largest society funerals ever held in that town, being taken part in by the brethren of the C. M. B. A. and of the Knights of Columbus, of both of which societies the deceased was a member. A special train from Charlottetown brought 50 members of the K. of C., and many friends of the deceased. There was a full quota of the C. M. B. A. from Summerside, and many members both of the C. M. B. A. and of the K. of C. from the West and all these made a large and most respectable turnout. The brethren to the number of 200 marched to the late home of the deceased, whence they escorted the remains to St. Paul's Church. The pall bearers were J. M. Noonan, Alex. McNeill, Frank Perry, for the C. M. B. A., and H. P. Wood, Dr. Johnson, and Seku McLellan, for the K. of C. The Gregorian Requiem Mass sung by the choir, under the direction of Professor Whitney, was conceded by the visitors to be the most beautiful and impressive funeral service ever rendered on the Island. At the Offertory a most solemn setting of De Profundis was rendered by the St. Paul male quartette, Messrs. Arsenault, McDonald, McLellan and Whitney. The celebrant was Rev. J. C. McKinnon, brother of the deceased, and rector of Annapolis Royal N. S. In the sanctuary with him were Messrs. D. Morrison, Carron, Monaghan, Gauthier, Bernard McDonald, Revs. J. J. McDonald, and J. A. McDonald, the pastor, Rev. J. C. McLean was Master of Ceremonies. At the close of the Mass, the Rev. J. J. McDonald preached an eloquent sermon on the text: "It is a holy and wholesome thing to pray for the dead that they may be released from their sins." After the service the Libera was sung by the choir, and then the procession formed and proceeded to the cemetery. At two o'clock a memorial service was held by the K. of C. in the C. M. B. A. Hall, attended by the resident and visiting Knights, and by the relatives and the intimate friends of the deceased.
