Well - Known Retired Captain Dies At Cardigan

A link between the sailormen of the past and those of the present was severed early yesterday morning when Capt. J. C. Macdonald passed away at his home in Cardigan.

Capt. Macdonald died after a lengthy illness. He had been confined to his bed for the past six months.

Though Capt. Macdonald was only 66 years of age when he died, he was a veteran of some fifty years at sea and had seen service on many ships, and in many waters during his long and successful career.

He retired about a year ago when the C.G.S. Montclair was sold to Russia. He had been captain of the Canadian Government ship since 1940. Prior to that he had served on the C.G.S. Aramora for some thirteen years.

He went on her in 1927, was promoted to chief officer in 1930 and shortly after that took over as master. The steamers Elliot and Stanley were some of the other ships on which he had served.

The late Capt. Macdonald was a man of fine principles and was loved and respected by all who knew him. He had the faculty of making friends both in his life at sea and also at home.

He leaves to mourn a sorrowing wife who was formerly Mary Josephine Doyle of Charlottetown and the following sons and daughters: Earl, Cardigan, Lieut. Herbert with the P.E.I. Highlanders; Frank in Halifax; Norbert with the R.C.A.F. at Moncton; Raymond at home; Hattie, Maiden Mass. who arrived home last night; and Mrs. George V. Fraser of Charlottetown.

There are also two sisters, Mrs. H. Barker, Belmont, Mass. and Mrs. R. R. Orleans of West Newton, Mass. Capt. J. C. Macdonald of Vancouver is a brother.
