THE ROAD TO ARRAS—This is the title of a dainty booklet of poems by Mr. Edgar W. Melnis, of this city, now studying in the University of Toronto. Most of the poems were written while the author was serving in the great war—and those of them previously published elicited most flattering commendation from some of the foremost literary critics in Canada and the United States. They show remarkable maturity of thought and feeling for so young an author, he being now only in his twenty-first year and only seventeen when he enlisted. The booklet is daintily covered, beautifully printed, with an excellent photograph of the author, and will make the most appropriate souvenir of Charlottetown or a Christmas present—and withal a reminder of the Great War, incidents in which form the subject of many of the poems. Mr. Melnis is already listed among Canada's foremost literateurs and no doubt this modest little volume will, in the not distant future, be followed by a larger one. In the meantime it is valuable as the beginning of what is evidently destined to be a more than ordinarily successful literary career.
