A RESOLUTION.—At a meeting of the Miramichi Presbytery on December 3rd the call from St. Peter's congregation, P. E. I., to Rev. J. M. A committee was appointed to prepare a resolution re Mr. McLeod's departure, which is as follows:—"The Presbytery of Miramichi receives with deep regret Mr. McLeod's decision to remove from its bounds. For a period of seventeen years with zeal and good judgment Mr. McLeod has prosecuted the work of the ministry in New Mills, one of our most important congregations. The work there has greatly prospered under his hand. The congregation is united and harmonious. Its liberality has become an example for others. Last year's contributions to the schemes of the church, amounted to \$130. Besides doing promptly and cheerfully his share of presbytery work for the past ten years, Mr. McLeod has been the painstaking and efficient clerk of presbytery. We record our loss sustained through Mr. McLeod's removal and our appreciation of the value of the services he rendered as a member and officer of our Court. We congratulate the presbytery of P. E. I. and the congregation of St. Peter's on acquiring a most useful member and faithful pastor, and we further express our sympathy for New Mills in the loss of their minister—"a workman needing not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of a valuable Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is to be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties.—Six months' residence upon the land of the lot in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$20 per acre. Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homesteaded pasture and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.
