—ARMISTICE DAY was duly observed at the Summerside Methodist Church on Sunday. The service opened with two minutes silence during which the congregation stood with bowed heads. An appropriate prayer was offered by the minister, the Rev. J. F. Denny after which "O God our help in ages past" was sung. The address dealt with the problems besetting the progress of peace. The preacher thought that a satisfactory solution would be reached only through the spirit of co-operation filling our international life, and guiding all international relationships. He showed how this principle of co-operation had been at work in human life. Our greatest hindrance to peace was probably a selfish provincialism which refused to recognize another's point of view. We needed a spirit which would rise superior to our social and religious prejudices, ancient and modern, and the racial scorn which embitters the discussion of the question of color. We are members one of another internationally as well as locally. There was a large congregation in the evening a special appeal being made to the young people to become practical workers for the cause of christianity which was defined by the preacher as the "loftiest as well as the most practical service known to mankind." Suitable anthems were rendered by the choir. Miss Strong presided at the organ.

More noise of looms, less clang of swords.

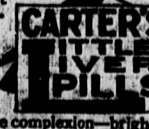
O waiting world, we hear thy call
