**Studebaker St. Regis Sedans are Full 6 Passenger**



Full six-passenger roominess is provided in new 1937 Studebaker two-door sedans. The front seat cushion is in one piece, just as in the four-door sedans, and the back of the front seat is divided in such a way that there is no apparent division in the center. Thus, while either of the two sides will tilt forward, the whole of the seat-back has the appearance—and the comfort—of one piece.

**PRESENTATION OF STUDEBAKERS OF 1937**

**New Models To Have Many Improvements.**

These new cars come to the public with many improvements and advancements over the Studebakers of 1936. No radical changes will be discovered, but there are many innovations and features that contribute to greater beauty, safety, economy and performance than any previous Studebakers have possessed. The 1937 Studebaker will be produced in two lines—the President Group and the Dictator group.

**ENGINEERING TAKES THE SPOTLIGHT**  
 Great improvements in the 1937 Studebakers vie with one another for the spotlight. Perhaps the most interesting of all is the President's new overdrive transmission and the fact that it is automatically selective. It may be put in or out at any speed above 35 miles per hour. To get in the overdrive the foot is lifted quickly from the accelerator and then applied gradually. To get it out the foot is lifted and then applied quickly. The unit is compact, light and quiet and by affording immediate access to direct drive provides the flashing acceleration of conventional gear—in either top gear or second—when ever needed.

**HYPOID REAR AXLE**  
 Now in demand by chassis-dissectors is the hypoid rear axle to be used on both President and Dictator models. As every engineer knows, hypoid rear axle gear are in point of design, midway between spiral bevel and worm gears. The hypoid rear axle is less sensitive to minor variations in body form and is the only gear combination known that actually improves with use.

The outstanding advantage of the hypoid axle is that, due to the lower pinion centering, a lower body floor can be used in the rear compartment without using a tunnel or sagging rear clearance. On the new Studebaker floor 13-1/2 in. lower at the rear provides a vast increase in floor height without

raising the height of the car.

**NEW DOUBLE DROP FRAME**  
 A third improvement on the 1937 Studebakers is the new double drop frame. This new frame design has the great strength of the box section side rail X-member construction that is found in the 1936 models. On the 1937 Studebakers there will be found new shock absorbers that are, contrary to the usual practice of the industry, built into the chassis and not added as an afterthought. They are neither bolted to the frame nor connected to the axle by links. They are known as the direct acting type. They are compact and embody automatic ride control, impact recoil and temperature control.

**TWIN LEVERS MAKE STEERING EASIER AND SAFER**  
 Designed to make these new Studebakers easier to handle than any previous models is the new twin lever type steering gear to be found on the 1937 models. The new steering gear is known as the twin lever or compound ratio type, so called because two studs are in engagement with the cam in contrast to the single stud heretofore employed. The new gear is described as giving easier steering and easier starting in cold weather because cranking is positive and continuous until the engine is running.

Another interesting change is the new location of the parking brake lever just below the instrument panel at the left of the steering wheel. It extends downward from behind the panel and its position gives the operator an easy direct pull. This new location clears up the floor boards in the front compartment and leaves the left door free of obstruction.

An improved gear shift, usually light, is obtained through a new synchronizer unit on both President and Dictator models.

**WHY CHANGE CLEAN OIL?**  
 For 1937 all Studebakers—Dictators as well as Presidents—have as standard equipment Fram oil and motor cleaners and motorists will be advised that oil need never be changed (except for the summer and winter seasonal change) if a new Fram cartridge is installed whenever the dip-stick shows that the oil has become dirty.

The well-known Studebaker automatic choke has been improved and simplified to give better accessibility for seasonal adjustments. Three adjustments are provided on the new choke to compensate for variations in the butane content of motor fuel. These adjustments may be made by any service man—and any driver may learn how to make them in three or four minutes.

The 1937 Dictators are equipped with a rubber insulated universal joint. The new shaft provides an elastic, insulated drive with no moving parts to wear and no lubrication requirements. It contributes a great deal to smoothness and quietness at high speeds.

An overrunning starting clutch, manually engaged on Dictator and dash button control on President models gives the new cars positive starting in cold weather because cranking is positive and continuous until the engine is running.
