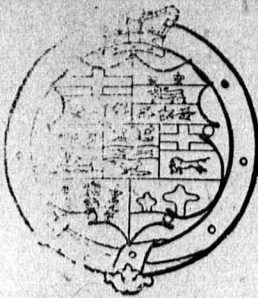

MAN MAIMED EVERY NINE MINUTES

New York, September 13.—"A member of the Brotherhood of trainmen is killed every seven hours and fifteen minutes and every nine minutes a man is maimed."

This was the testimony today of William Lee representing the order of Railway Trainmen, at a meeting of the arbitration committee in the controversy between forty-two eastern railroads and their conductors and trainmen over the employers' demands for more pay and shorter hours. When this statement was later challenged by Elisha Lee, counsel for the railroads, William Lee cited the statistics in the inter-state commerce commission's report. This report on June 30 last gave 3,635 railroad employees killed in the United States during the year.

William Lee in further testimony said: "The south is standardizing its rates by slow stages."
