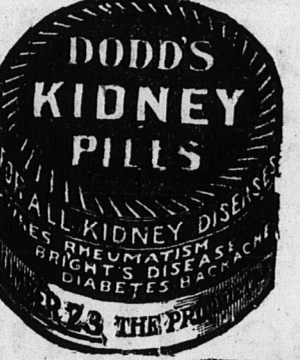

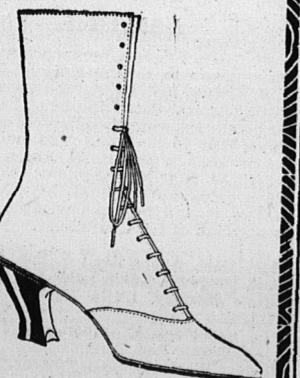

HUN CASUALTIES IN JANUARY

LONDON, February 20.—Casualties in the German army, exclusive of colonial troops, reported in the German casualty lists in the month of January 1917, totalled 77,534 officers and men killed, wounded, prisoners or missing. The totals compiled from the list follows:

Table of casualties: Killed and died 15,906; Prisoners 1,645; Missing 11,874; Wounded 48,109; Total 77,534.
