MR. FINLAYSON ON INSPECTION TRIP.

ST. JOHN, Feb. 14.—The shad hatchery which was established last year at Hampton by the federal government has proved very successful, according to Alex. Finlayson, of Ottawa, inspector of hatcheries, who arrived in the city yesterday.

He will leave this morning to inspect a hatchery at Middleton, N.S., also established last year, and from there will continue around the Maritime Provinces. He is responsible for all the hatcheries of the Dominion, and the territory which he covers extends from the Skeena River, in northern British Columbia, to the Magdalen Islands.

In reply to a question regarding plans for additional hatching plants in this district, Mr. Finlayson said that there was nothing which he could divulge at present.

MILITIA CHANGES.

OTTAWA, Feb. 13.—Two important announcements appear in the militia general orders. The first provides officially for the reserve formation of the active militia. This is to be divided into two categories, one is to be the reserve of officers borne on the general list as at present.

The second creates the appointment of an officer to be known as "commanding divisional artillery." The appointment shall be tenable for a period of four years, and may carry with it promotion, by selection to the rank of colonel. It is limited to divisions in which there are not less than three organized field artillery brigades, which train and practice annually, and is confined to officers who have commanded a brigade of field or of heavy artillery.

The officer commanding divisional artillery is, under the divisional commander, responsible for the command and training of the artillery of the division. He is also responsible for the command and training of other artillery units of the field army stationed within the divisional area.

An officer to be graded as a brigade major, will be appointed to the staff of the divisional artillery commander.

SCORES TRIPLE ALLIANCE.

SASKATOON, Sask., Feb. 13.—Today's session of the Grain Growers' Convention was marked by a most scathing denunciation of the allied manufacturing interests by G. F. Chipman, editor of the Grain Growers' Guide. Railways and manufacturers were classed as a triple alliance more powerful than battleships and soldiers.

"The railways and banking organizations have as their aim," said the speaker, "that of keeping all privileges they have and getting all there were in sight."

"There was a triple alliance sitting around mahogany tables in Montreal, consisting of the railways, the banks' association and the Canadian Manufacturers' Association, a triple alliance greater than dreadnoughts and soldiers."

"The board of directors of the C. P. R. controlled the Bank of Montreal, the Royal Trust Co., the Oglivie, and the Lake of the Woods Milling companies, the Dominion Express Company. In the same way, the directors of the C. N. R. controlled the Canadian Bank of Commerce and were also the biggest men in the largest industries established in Canada."

"It is impossible," he said, "to expect the C. N. R. and the C. P. R. to be in serious competition when their directors sit side by side on the directorate of other business institutions in Canada. Two-thirds of our bank directorates are interlocking with other directorates and are feeding upon the public."

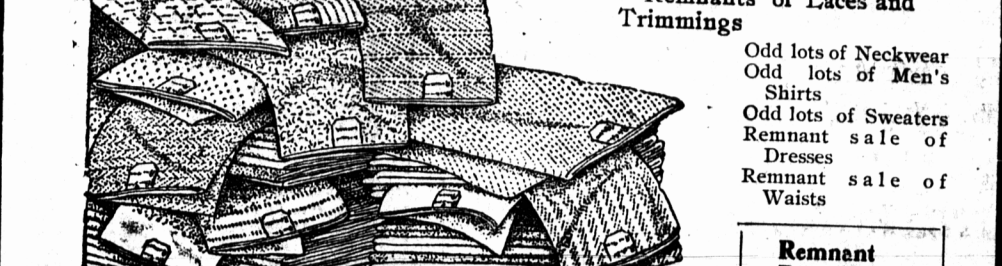
