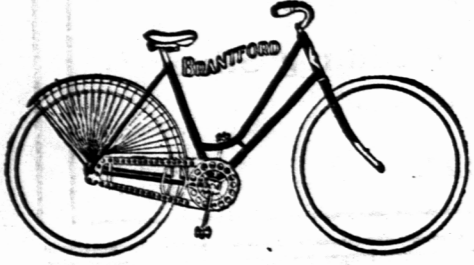
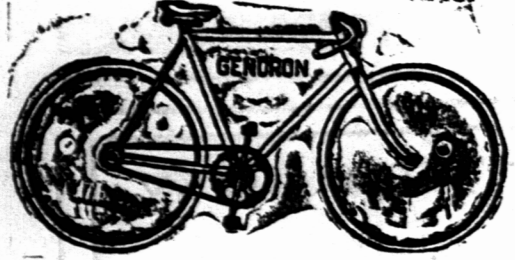

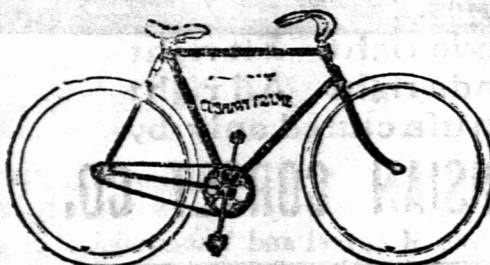

THE body of Edgar Trenholm of Bayfield, N. B., who was drowned near the mouth of Summerside Harbor on May 1st, was found yesterday about 11 o'clock on the shore near Sea Weed Road, by Mr. Joseph Wedge, (Febian). The body, which was considerably eaten, drifted ashore either yesterday morning or the night previous. The remains, which were brought to town by Mr. H. A. 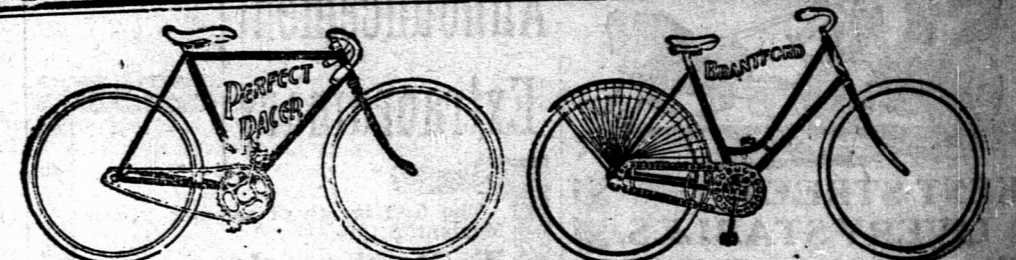

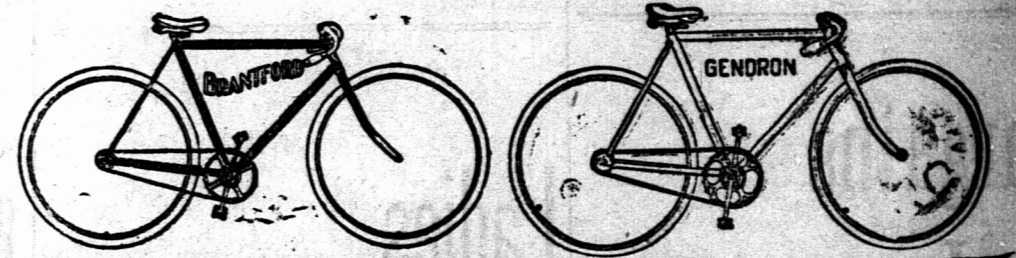
