**Marine And Fisheries Estimates Passed**

 OTTAWA, April 11.—Main estimates for the department of Marine and Fisheries totalling \$5,295,610 were passed in committee of supply of the House of Commons Saturday afternoon. Included in this total were items of \$2,878,120 for light house and postal service \$260,000 for meteorological service \$134,610 for steamboat inspections and \$502,980 for civil administration.

**Steamer For Newfoundland**

Messrs Conrad and Company have received advice from Halifax that the Newfoundland Canada Traders Ltd., will operate the steamer Magna this season between St. John, N. B., Halifax, N. S., Charlottetown, and St. John's, Nfld.

The calling at St. Pierre will be discontinued, but this steamer will call at Bay Roberts, Carleton Place and Port Union on the north east coast of Newfoundland and will also touch at Catalina, Belle Island and Harbor Grace if sufficient cargo offers.

In this connection it may be noted that two-thirds of the entire population of Newfoundland live along the coast, and as this is the first time island shippers have had direct sailings to those places an immense new market is opened up which our shippers should take full advantage of.

The first sailing from Charlottetown will be around the last of April and will be advertised later in the daily papers. Further information can be had by applying to Conrad and Company.
