TRAVELING SMITH QUILTS

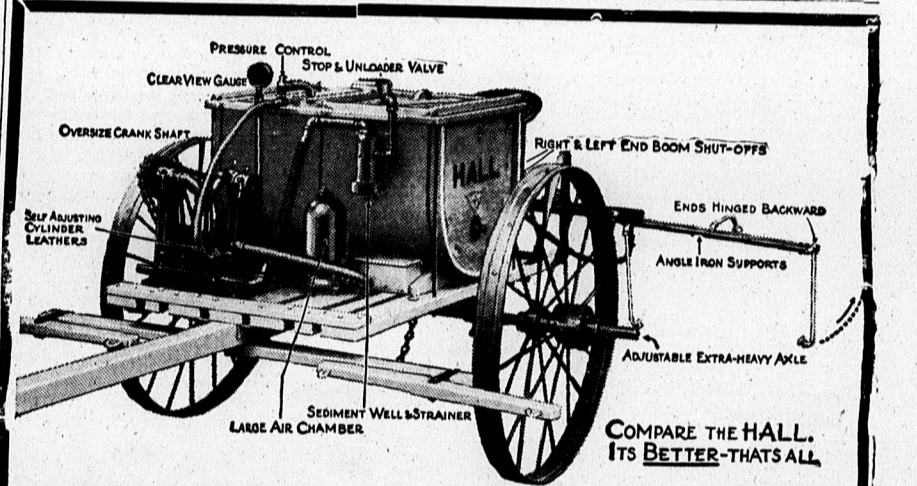
