The Morning Guardian will be issued on Saturday morning next, but not on Monday morning following.

The Chicago Tribune describes Sir Archibald Douglas, the newly appointed Vice Admiral of the North American squadron, as large hearted, single minded, and a popular officer, who has not the faintest idea of art, but who makes up for his Philistinism in this respect by being a splendid sportsman. Moreover, he possesses the advantage—in American eyes—of having been born on this side of the Atlantic, having not only first seen daylight in Quebec, but having also received his early education there. He saw some service on the Canadian lakes in 1866, at the time of the threatened Fenian invasion, and while at the head of the Imperial Japanese Naval College at Tokio was brought into contact with a number of American naval officers who held professorships under his direction, and who had been lent by Uncle Sam to the Mikado.

With sincere regret The Guardian parts company with D. K. Dobie, who for over three years past has had charge of the City news department of this paper. Mr. Dobie has been for some eleven years connected with this journal, filling successively the positions of Night Foreman and Day Foreman in the Mechanical Department before becoming attached to the writing staff. In all these branches of newspaper work he displayed exceptional intelligence, energy and diligence. In accepting a position on the staff of the Halifax Herald, Mr. Dobie carries with him to the larger field the best wishes of his fellow-workers of The Guardian and of many friends in Charlottetown and throughout the Island.

Some interest has been excited through out Canada by the fact that Editor McAdam of the Sandon, B. C. Paystreak, is serving a nine month sentence for contempt of court. Here is the paragraph which got him into trouble and called down the wrath of the Judges. It referred to a case pending in court:

"J. K. Clark's famous case against J. Frank Collum for commission on the Arlington deal has again been postponed—this time until next December. J. K. has now been twenty-eight months trying to break into the British Columbia courts but owing to Collum's pull cannot get his case heard, and it is evident that the courts intend to continue putting him off on one pretext or another until he dies or quits the game. We pride ourselves on our British fair play, but we maintain a string of judges who are corrupt, lazy, debauched and prejudiced and we permit them to conduct the business of the country in a manner that is simply outrageous. The two handed gun man is a lesser danger to society than a corrupt judiciary."

We fail to see how the British Columbia Judges could avoid taking judicial notice of such charges whether they were or were not as corrupt, lazy and debauched as the Paystreak charged or not.

The automobile is in our midst, and is a highly creditable machine which is doing its work smoothly and well. So far as our observation goes the driver is careful to avoid, as far as possible, frightening the horses which from time to time show some fear of the new conveyance, but both horses and their drivers will soon learn to accommodate themselves to the new order of things.
