HOTBED FORSIGHTEDNESS

It is not too late, or too soon, to clean out the old hotbeds or to prepare for new ones. Unless the soil used in the hotbed is to be exchanged for fresh earth, it should be shoveled from the bed and tossed into a pile nearby. The decayed manure from the bottom is scattered over the pile and thoroughly mixed with it to form rich soil for next year's bed. Over this goes a heavy coat of straw or

leaves held down by bits of board to keep it from blowing. Some farmers find it convenient to use evergreen boughs instead of straw for the outer covering. Better still, if the hotbed is to be started early and the locality is very cold, in winter, put the earth in a shed or barn nearby where it will be ready for use at any time. Pits for new hotbeds may be dug any time before the ground freezes too hard. Choose a location where the beds will face the south and where they will be protected from cold north winds and late spring storms. Sometimes the earth taken from the new pit is suitable for use in the hotbed, but this is the exception rather than the rule. A few loads of leaf mold from the woods mixed with good surface soil from the garden will provide an ideal hotbed filler. It is better in this case also to have the compost under cover where it will be available for use when wanted.—A. B. C.

Olympic Medals For Maritime Men Arrive

HALIFAX, March 3.—G. G. Thomas, Halifax M. P., B. A. A. U. representative has received from President Covey, medals won by Ted Coster, Arthur MacAdam and Harold Larriere, at the Olympic trials in Montreal last summer. Coster, running under the colors of St. John, finished second in the 400-yard dash, defeating some of the best men in Upper Canada. Larriere was second in the one-mile run. MacAdam receives a medal for boxing, being the runner up in the light heavyweight class. Coster is now at Dalhousie. The medals will be handed over to the athletes at Morton and Thomson's Barrington street.

WINTER CARE OF WEANED COLTS

The ailments of young, newly weaned colts are more often due to carelessness, thoughtlessness or ignorance of their owners, than to any other cause. The following two queries are only samples of many that are suggestive of want of thought on the part of colt owners, rather than carelessness or lack of any desire to own good colts. One query reads: "I have three registered draft foals six months old that have worms. Please advise treatment."

"Another colt owner writes as follows: "I have two weaning colts that are thin. What is the best feed to give them in winter? The mothers of these colts are also thin in flesh and had worms during the summer."

In the first query it can be noted that the owner had taken every care to get the best class of colts by keeping pedigreed mares for his horse breeding arrangement. But worms in young colts give some indications that the care and feeding must have been somewhat at fault. Worms in colts are often caused by leaving them in the fall after weaning time, on some bare bitten pastures, generally the rough waste land. They rapidly lose flesh and are therefore in a fit state to become the nursery for worms.

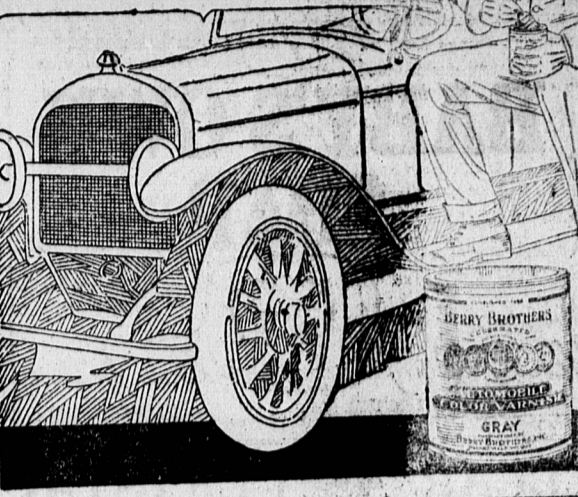
Not a few colts are infested with blood worms that are very deadly and unfortunately there is no specific remedy, and as they are true blood suckers they often sap the life of a foal and cause death. The blood worm is very small, like a zinc shingle nail and red or pink in color. If the worms happen to be the variety termed Ascaris Megalocaphala they can be readily destroyed and do not prove so detrimental in their effects. These can be readily known by their yellowish white color, are almost as large as a pencil and six to eight inches or more in length and are also tapered at the end. The colts should be fed generously on oats, bran, roots and the best of hay. Night and morning there should be placed in their feed a heaping teaspoonful of a mixture of two parts of table salt and one part each of flowers of sulphur and dried sulphate of iron. The dose should be continued for a week and then discontinued for ten days and then the treatment should be repeated. This treatment will destroy the large variety of worms and may also kill the blood worms. It will act as a tonic and along with good feeding may save the colts.

With regard to colts that are thin, as described by the second question so as to ensure their proper development it is important that they should be well fed and cared for during their first winter. A suitable grain feed for colts of this age is made up of eight parts crushed oats, four parts bran and one part oil meal. There are such constitutional differences in colts that it is not possible to formulate the quantity of grain feed to give them but colts are more often stunted than given too much. When once they are accustomed to grain feed they will eat more

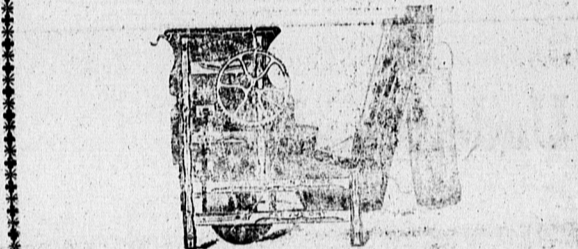

at this age than is generally supposed, they should never be given more than they can clean up. The measure is the feeder's eye, who can gauge the quantity by careful observation, the health and growth of the animals under his charge.

Colts should have salt and pure clean water at all times. If this is impossible water frequently—once a day is not sufficient. It is as necessary that newly weaned foals have an abundance of pure water as it is to feed them liberally. They should be watered at least three times a day and should be given plenty of time to drink. Colts that are stunted the first winter never attain their proper size and development. The rough age should be clean, sound hay or alfalfa, free from dust or mustiness.

Young colts should not be exposed to rains or stormy weather. Their stalls should be well ventilated and well lighted. The man who attempts to raise colts in a damp, dark place will not find the business profitable. When it is possible, to do so have the stalls on the south side of the building and furnished with glass windows that will admit the sunlight but so securely protect that the glass cannot be reached by the colts. Pure air is essential to health as pure food and sunlight is a valuable tonic.

All excrements, both liquid and solid should be removed from the stall every day. To prevent offensive odors, the floor should be sprinkled occasionally with gypsum or air-slacked lime. It is also a good idea to spray the floor and walls occasionally. Along with grooming, this will help to keep down vermin. Lice starts with filth, so clean surroundings and a clean skin by frequent grooming is necessary.

Flock owners should aim to keep breeding ewes in a thrifty condition making as much use as possible succulent feeds, like alfalfa or clover hay, turnips and silage. The ewes should not be allowed to become too thin even if some grain has to be fed. However, grain feeding should not be necessary until just prior to lambing time.
