

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 16, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased, of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the homestead as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has no permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands, Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.

ENGLAND PRESSED WITH DREADNAUGH

PORTSMOUTH, Eng., Oct. 20.—The successful conclusion of the trials of the British battleship Dreadnaught, the latest exponent of the theory that future wars will be with great battleships, heavy armor and huge guns, will not fail to give intense satisfaction to the British press and public. This is because they have been so anxious and gloomy prognostications that the Dreadnaught could not stand the strain of her great broadsides, and also because the successful surmounting of her trial disproved completely the rumors that there was some defect in the construction of the battleship. Even the great gun salvo today, said by those on board to have been terrifying, produced no injury. No deck plates buckled nor was the blast dangerous, although there was some injury to the vessel's lighter fittings. One reason for this is found in the great length of the guns, which being the missiles clear of the ship's side when fired at the beam. The discharge of all the eight of the Dreadnaught's ten and twelve inch guns simultaneously represented three tons of metal in projectiles. The roar of the salvo was heard plainly in Portsmouth and all over the Isle of Wight. The Dreadnaught will be finished for the accommodation of a full crew and will then receive her maiden commission in the Atlantic Fleet.
