# AFRICA BENEFITS BY ALFRED BEIT'S WILL

\$12,000,000 to Endow the Cape to Cairo Railroad—He Left Many Public Bequests—Large Sums go to Various Educational and Charitable Institutions

LONDON, July 26.—Mr. Beit's executors, who are his brother Otto, his cousin, Franz Voelkel, and his partner, Mr. Verneker, have issued a statement of the public bequests made by Mr. Beit. These total a few thousand short of \$2,000,000, in money and stocks, in addition to some art works and the estate of the late Horster Jaeger, near Hamburg. This estate is bequeathed to the City of Hamburg, to which is also given a magnificent plate from the service of Isabelle Gonzaga d'Este, Reynolds' painting of Mrs. Boone and daughter, and Polajual's bronze statue of Hercules, are given to the Imperial Museum at Berlin, and Reynolds' Lady Cookburn and children to the British National Gallery.

The largest bequest is \$1,200,000 to endow the Cape to Cairo Railway and Telegram scheme. The will deals with all the details of this endowment, which is introduced thus: "I believe that by the promotion, construction, furtherance generally of railways and telegraphs including wireless telegraphy, telephones or other methods of transmission of persons, goods and messages, civilization will be best advanced and expedited in Africa, for the benefit of the inhabitants of that country, whether native or immigrant, and I know from experience how difficult it is at times to find funds for the construction of such methods of transmission in new and undeveloped countries."
