STEAM MANGLE EXPLODES.

NORTH ADAMS, April 1.—With a roar which could be heard all over the neighborhood a large mangle in a steam laundry on Lincoln street exploded, blowing down the plant, and completely wrecking the machine.

The mangle which was used for ironing sheets and all flat pieces was made up of one large roller and several smaller ones, and the larger roller, which was about 35 inches in diameter, was heated with live steam under a pressure of 45 pounds to the square inch. It was this roller that exploded. It was about 8.30 o'clock, and preparations were being made to run the first batch of flat pieces through the mangle, and the huge roller was being heated after hav-

ing been allowed to thoroughly cool over Sunday. Mr. Osborne was standing with his back to the mangle near the elevator, about eight feet away, and Miss Clara Roy, who had charge of the mangle, was standing behind a bench near the other end of the machine.

None of the girls who were at work in the room was injured, although a large iron bolt weighing about half a pound passed between two of them who were standing on the opposite side of the room and passed out through a window.
