

There is an article on the Royal Military College, with illustrations by Randolph Carlyle, and one likewise on "Victoria's English Palaces" by Emily P. Weaver. The Garden of Old Delights is a delightful sketch by Miss L. M. Montgomery, author of "Anne of Green Gables." Other articles are "New Methods in College Athletics," by Christopher Conway; "Titles by F. Blake Crofton, Australian Literature," by Katherine Hale, and "Prince Albert to Liverpool" by Water, by Len G. Shaw, with short stories by Helen E. Williams and Robert J. Hewton, and verse by Isabel Ecclestone MacKay, William J. Fisher, Arthur Wentworth Eaton and H. W. Dakeway. There are also some fine photographs of the late King Edward, King George, Queen Mary and the Duke of Cornwall.


