The Car Owner's Scrap Book

The Windshield.

Sometimes the glass in a windshield will become loose and cause a very annoying rattle. It is almost impossible for the average car owner to close the windshield frame so that it will grip the glass tighter, without the risk of breaking the glass. But if the glass is not to loose the rattle can be stopped by filling in the space in the frame with shellac. Use a sharp-pointed stick, or a small pencil brush, to apply the shellac, and apply very slowly, allowing the shellac to flow into the cracks and pack tightly.

New Piston Rings

Smoking cannot be overcome by installing new piston rings if the pistons are loose and the cylinders are not true. But regrinding the cylinders and fitting new pistons and rings will overcome the smoking.

It is also very necessary to use a good oil of the proper grade, the oil recommended by the manufacturer, and then change the oil frequently. It is advisable to replace the engine oil every one thousand miles to insure the best results. When oil that is thinned by gasoline works past the pistons it will produce smoking.

Tire Chains

Unless skid chains are adjusted properly the tires will be seriously damaged within a short time. If cuts are discovered at regular intervals around a casing, it is a sure indication of a tight chain. The more loosely a chain is adjusted the easier it is on the tire. In fact, they should be adjusted as loosely as possible, without allowing them to strike the fenders. This distributes the strain around the entire surface of the tire by permitting the chain to move slightly with each revolution of the wheel.

A Nut and Bolt Suggestion

When necessary either to tighten or to loosen an obstinate bolt by holding a wrench at each end of the

bolt, and no assistant is at hand, try the following plan provided the bolt is in some position where the jack can be used. Select a soft block of wood and place the end of the wood against the bolt head. Then work the jack against the wood until the bolt-head sinks into the wood. The rest of the operation is obvious.

Overheating

It is a fallacy to believe that overheating of the engine is purely a summer trouble. There are various causes for overheating, such as a clogged radiator, driven to long in low gear, a loose or broken fan belt, the spark throttle retarded too much, or the gasoline mixture too rich.

Emery Cloth

Emery cloth should not be used on the commutator of the generator. Not only is it a conductor of electricity, but emery also embeds itself in the commutator and is sure to produce rapid wear.

A Glass Oil Funnel.

Many workmen prefer a glass funnel for pouring oil into the breather pipe, as well as for many other purposes, on account of its transparency. And a very practical glass funnel can be made within a few minutes in the following manner. Secure a round quart bottle of clear glass. Saturate a piece of cord in kerosene or turpentine. Tie this cord tightly around the bottle, about an inch from the bottom. Ignite the cord with a match and as soon as the flame dies out, tap the bottom of the bottle sharply with a wooden mallet and the bottom will break off around the line where the cord was fastened.

A Greasy Wrench

Oftentimes a greasy wrench will slip out of the fingers and go down into the clutch housing, or into some other part of the car where it

requires a great amount of labor and time to retrieve it. But this can be avoided if a string about fifteen inches long is tied to the wrench and the other end to the wrist. To take this precaution does not take more than a minute, while a greasy tool slipping into some inaccessible part of the car may require an hour or more of unnecessary time to recover it.

Spring Bushings

If it is found difficult to remove the bushing from the end of the first spring leaf, due to the bushing having worn thin on one side, and a sufficient hole cannot be secured to drive it out, slip the new bushing over the shackle bolt, replace the bolt in the old bushing and drive it back into place. If necessary to do the work with the spring in place, hold a block of wood against the back of the spring and use a heavy hammer.

Vibration

Excessive vibration when starting a car can often be avoided by opening the throttle wider and engaging the clutch gradually. Another cause for this vibration is when the clutch takes hold suddenly. Vibration when picking up speed in high gear is generally caused by the car travelling too slowly while the gears are being changed.

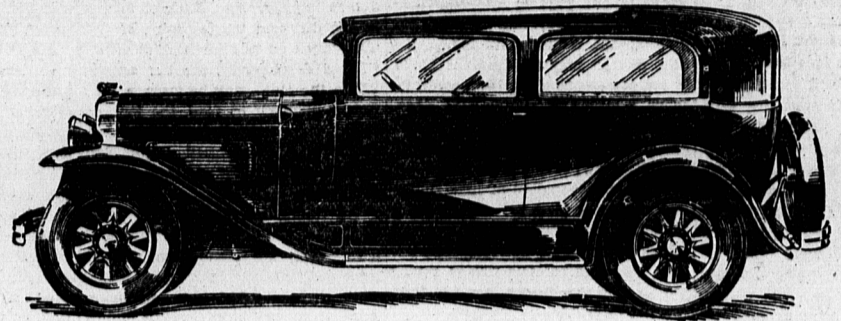
Mud

Never allow mud to remain on the body of the car and expect to maintain its glossy finish. This, of course, is particularly important with a new car. Mud must be removed just as soon as possible to avoid stains and to preserve the polish. First, it should be thoroughly soaked and then removed by allowing a stream of water to play gently over the surface. Never use a heavy stream of water or it is liable to drive the grit into the finish.

Gasoline Fire

Do not try to smother a gasoline fire by throwing a bucket of water onto the flames. Water and gasoline refuse to mix. The gasoline will merely float on top of the water and have a tendency to spread the flames. If a fire extinguisher is not at hand smother the flames with sand or in some other way.

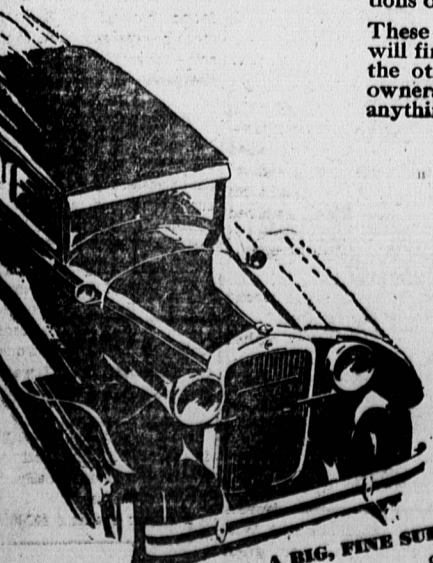
