There will be no delivery by letter carrier, and the outgoing afternoon mails will be closed at 12 o'clock for despatch. There will be no mail collection from the Street Letter Boxes. These changes in the manner of observing the holiday are the result of protests received from organized postal employees against distinction being made between one branch of the service and another in so far as statutory holidays are concerned. 6587-6-26M31.

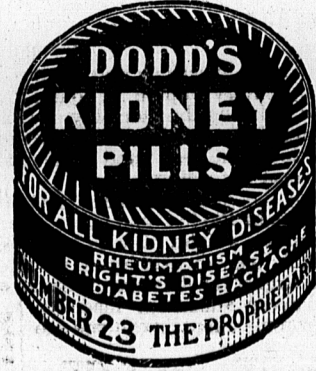

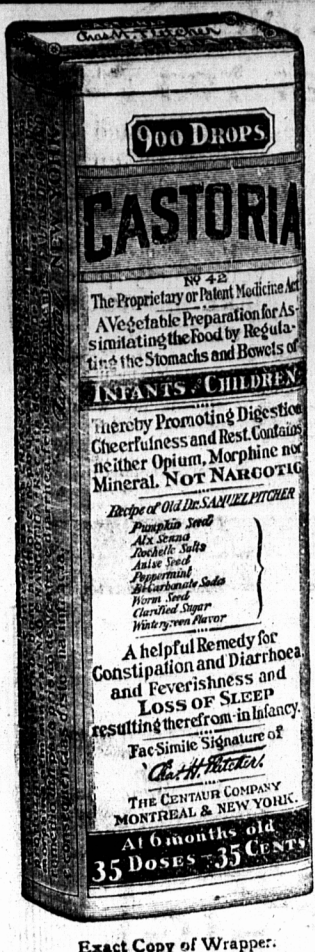
