Lloyd George Appeared Before a Mass Meeting in Albert Hall to Announce a Clause for Women Suffrage When a Wild Outburst Occurred. Women Cained to Seats. Chains Cut and Women Carried Out Screaming.

LONDON, Dec. 6—(Special)—The wildest demonstration recorded in the history of the suffrage movement occurred at Albert Hall, Saturday night.

TERRIBLE RESULTS OF A MEXICAN OIL WELL

The Fumes Are So Strong That Metals Turn Black, Birds Are Dying and People Are Killed. The Government Aiding the Company in Stopping the Deadly Fumes. Towns 65 Miles Away Affected.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6—(Special)—Fumes so strong that all metals sixty-five miles away are turning black, buzzards, parrots and other birds are dying in great numbers and the eyesight of many people for away is affected, are announced as remarkable results from a great flow of a Mexican oil well at Dosoboc, since the recent fierce conflagration which consumed several million barrels of oil.

best engineering skill has been brought to control the flow and conserve the oil. Immense earthen reservoirs have been built but the oil passed over these and spread over a lagoon for several miles.

Five miles, are experiencing the blackening of metal from this cause and all ships passing near the well show the effects of the poisonous gases. Two laborers with ten miles entering the current of deadly fumes were instantly killed.

SCIENTISTS TO BUILD FINE CHURCH IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK, Dec. 5.—Christian Scientists will erect another temple of worship in New York. Options are understood to have been obtained on a \$400,000 site on Riverside Drive, overlooking the Hudson. It is proposed to have a church edifice rivaling in beauty of architecture any other structure in America. It will be a monument to the powerful faith of which Mary Baker Eddy is the head and pastor emerita.

CONFERENCE OF POWERS

A Notable Gathering in London Called to Confer on Laws for Naval Warfare and Formation of International Prize Court.

LONDON, December 5.—The conference of the powers called by Great Britain for the framing of a code of laws for naval warfare and for the formation of the international prize court recommended by The Hague Congress, was open at the foreign office yesterday. With an interval for the Christmas holidays, it is expected the conference will continue until February 1st.

The American delegates are Rear Admiral Charles Stockton and Professor Gratton Wilson, of Brown University. Commander John H. Gibson, naval attaché at the London embassy, will act as aide. Great Britain will be represented by the Earl of Desart and Captain Charles L. Otley, director of naval intelligence, and secretary of the committee of imperial defence. An address of welcome was delivered by Foreign Secretary Sir Edward Grey. At the suggestion of Germany, the powers have submitted their views on various points. Great Britain, Japan and the United States are agreed in principle at least on the most important proposals.
