

SENATE HEARINGS ON RECIPROcity ENDED

President Fights Against Any Amendments to the Bill Committee to Discuss its Report -- Senator Lodge Intimates That He Will Withdraw His Fishing Bounty Amendment and Vote For the Treaty.

WASHINGTON, June 5.—To Senator Stone, of Missouri, President Taft again made it clear that he is opposed to any amendment whatsoever to the Canadian reciprocity agreement. Senator Stone had heard a report that administration was not entirely sincere, and that Senator Root had been assured privately that the president would not be displeased if his amendments were adopted.

"I came to the White House," said the senator, "to find out for myself whether the president was in earnest in opposing the Root amendment and I found out. He told me that he was against the amendment proposed by Senator Root and would be against any proposed by any other senator, Democratic or Republican. That settles it for me. I am going back to the senate to carry the fight along these lines. Every true friend of reciprocity will do the same thing. If we begin by tacking on harmless amendments we will end by attaching others which will destroy the bill."

TO FARMERS

Cut worms are reported from different parts of the Province as being very bad this year and it would be well for people to be on their guard against them. The Report of the Dept. of Agriculture for 1910 on page 344, contains a description of the cut worm, together with remedies as follows: "Fortunately there is a very satisfactory remedy which can easily be applied; it is called the poison bran-mash. It is made by mixing 1 lb of Paris Green in 50 lbs of bran, stirring constantly and adding the poison little by little. This is moistened by 2 qts. of cheap molasses, previously diluted in about 1 gal of warm water. The whole must be thoroughly mixed to such an extent the bran will crumble through the fingers and obtain a soft lump. The mash is then thoroughly distributed through the infested plants or plot. The worms come out at night and devour it in preference to the plants and go off to some convenient hiding place to die."
