The Officers for Ensuing Year.

THE PAPERS READ

Provoke Discussion Which Resulted in Much Good to Those Present.

Thursday afternoon fourth session 2.30 Devotional meeting led by Mrs. Leard. At 3 p. m. the President took the chair and the work of the session commenced. In the absence of Mrs. Holmes who was to have read a paper on mothers' meetings Mrs. Strong read a well prepared paper on the above subject the object being to show that the W. C. T. U. work in all its departments is purely educational. How many times have we heard mothers exclaim, "How I wish there had been such things as mothers' meetings when I was bringing up my children, how much better I could have trained my boys and girls. How many of the mothers realize the part they play in moulding the character of the men and women of the future. The training of a child does not begin at its birth, the training of the mother has much to do with her influences upon the child committed to her care. If she has not been properly and carefully instructed herself she is incapable of exerting such an influence upon her child as will fit her for the sacred duties of citizenship.

We look upon life as a sacred gift, the parent is divinely appointed to put the child in the right possession of his faculties. Too many parents seem to forget that the child has any rights whatever. Let the child know that he is the keeper of his own potentiality. Of course he must be taught reverence and obedience, but the mothers should guard against harshness and haste in judgment, always giving the child an opportunity to explain before inflicting punishment.

The object of mothers' meetings is not for a few women to get together and discuss the faults (real or fancied) of their neighbors. They were designed to give the mothers who attend the benefit of the experience and advice of the mothers who have passed over the same road and are willing to help those who are having similar experiences.

This paper was spoken to by Mrs. Rutherford who called attention to and suggested certain books which were invaluable for mothers who have children committed to their care. It has also been proven that the use of alcohol is absolutely unnecessary in the treatment of the ill of childhood. This statement is substantiated by the attitude of more than one hospital that is doing without it altogether.

Mrs. R. J. Campbell, Mrs. Baker, Mrs. Johnson, Mrs. Irving, Mrs. Doull and others discussed the paper and added advice and suggestions which would be helpful to the mothers present.

Mrs. R. J. Campbell read a paper on "What is expected of the 20th century woman." Following is a synopsis:

In looking forward to what is expected of the 20th century woman it is necessary to look back and in comparison view what has been achieved by some of the women of the 19th century. Our late beloved Queen stands at the head of the list as a pure minded, saintly, womanly, woman. Frances Willard lamented as she is since she is gone, was devoted to doing all she could to alleviate the wrongs that are endured by her sex. Florence Nightingale also stands prominent among women of the past century. Going out as she did very early in the century, when even the best men did not look upon women's work as they do now, she is deserving of our highest respect as one who did all she could to alleviate suffering, besides laying the foundation of the field hospital movement.
