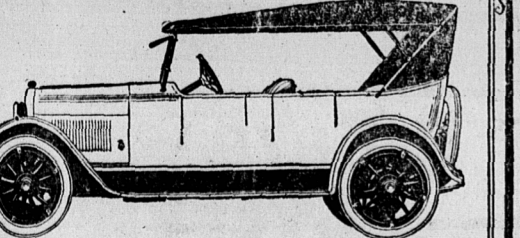

YOUNG MEN'S SERVICE—One of the largest congregations in the history of the Cavendish church gathered for the young men's service held on Sunday night June 10th. The church including the ladies was crowded to its utmost capacity. The ushers and singers were chosen from the young men of Cavendish. The male choir, which was representative of the different sections of the congregation, rendered a beautiful and splendid anthem, Mr. Charles McKenzie was the organist for the evening and efficiently discharged his duties. On the platform with the pastor Rev. J. S. Bonell were four young men Mr. Ray Woolner, President of the Rustico Young Men's Group and president over the meeting, Mr. Robert Toombs of Mayfield read from the Old Testament and Mr. Cyril Toombs of Rustico read from the New Testament. Mr. Stirling Brown of New Glasgow led the congregation in an earnest and thoughtful prayer. The sermon for the boys and girls was told by Mr. Brown. In a really remarkable address for one so new to the art of public speaking he vividly pictured the life of a cricketer player of his home school in England and told of his many action in resigning from the team because of the vile language used by some of its members. His courage was the means of creating a cleaner and manlier atmosphere throughout the whole school. He afterwards went back and led his team to victory. This heroism so early displayed in his youth led him at last to lay down his life for the natives of the South Sea Island. Young and old were deeply affected by Mr. Brown's address. After the anthem by the choir the Pastor gave the address for young men Subject—"Baseball and the Game of Life." Lessons were taken from the game of baseball and applied to the greater game of life. The address was listened to with rapt attention by the very large congregation. The hearty congregational singing was a striking feature of the meeting. The whole service was one that will be long remembered by those who were privileged to attend.

SUDDEN DEATH OF P. E. I. YOUNG MAN.—A sad fatality occurred at Dan McLeod's lobster factory at Picton Island early last Friday morning. A young man named Henry Compton, a native of Prince Edward Island, was found dead in bed, evidently having succumbed to an attack of heart failure. The young man, who was about 19 years of age, retired to his bed as usual on Thursday night, but through the night some of his comrades heard him moaning. Upon investigation they found that the young man had passed away. An inquest was held on Friday, before Coroner Young, and a verdict of death from natural causes was returned.

ENORMOUS LOSS OF LIFE IN RUSSIA
STOCKHOLM, June 11.—Russian correspondents of the Stockholm, Tidningen report that nearly four hundred persons have been drowned and 70,000 rendered homeless by floods in the lower Volga River region.

MOSCOW, June 11.—Another far off corner of Russia—Ferghana, Province in Turkestan—has been stricken with famine. A message received here says that four hundred thousand persons are affected by the food shortage which has resulted in many deaths. The population is reported to be eating grass.

IRELAND PREPARES TO REDEEM BONDS SOLD IN AMERICA
DUBLIN, June 12.—A bill is to be introduced into the Dail this session to carry into effect the pledge made by Michael Collins that the Irish Government would redeem all the Irish Republican bonds.

These bonds, to the amount of about \$10,000,000, were floated in the United States, in Ireland and elsewhere, and contain an undertaking that they would be redeemed six months after the establishment in Ireland of an Irish Republic. Michael Collins claimed that the treaty, apart from its form, effectively established Irish freedom, and that the condition on which the bonds were issued had been practically realized.

Despite the difficult Irish financial position, President Cosgrave, as finance minister, had decided that all the bonds shall be paid off.

IN MEMORIAM
MRS. JOHN A. MacNEILL

At Grand River, Lot 14, on Thursday, May 24, as the brightening eastern sky betokened the coming of day, the soul of Mrs. John A. MacNeill passed peacefully away to the Great Beyond to reap the rewards of a life well spent. In the spring of 1921, Mrs. MacNeill suffered a stroke of paralysis and since then, although not in her usual vigorous health, was able to be around and on the road to what would be her ultimate recovery. In March of this year another paralytic stroke came on and from that time her strength gradually decreased until on the above mentioned day her spirit soared forth to the shores of eternity.

During her illness she was frequently visited by her beloved pastor Rev. John A. McDonald.

The funeral was held Saturday, May 26, at St. Patrick's church, when a large concourse of sorrowing relatives and friends paid their last respects to the departed. High Requiem Mass was chanted by Rev. J. A. McDonald, who also officiated at the grave.

The full choir was ably assisted by Rev. Dr. Mousgan, Misouche and Dr. G. P. McDonald, Richmond. The pall bearers were Gtas McNeill, David Cameron, James McDonald, Limus MacDonald, Marshall MacLellan and John D. Lecky. Besides her sorrowing husband there are left to mourn three daughters, Mrs. J. Fleming, Patricia, Alberta, Miss Lucille and Miss Stella at home, one son, Limus J. at home also a sister and brother Mrs. Margaret Cameron, Wellington and Peter J. Cameron of Ellis River, Lot 16. May her soul rest in peace.

On April 10th, 1923, a gloom was cast over Central Bedoune and the adjoining communities, when it became known that Patrick McBride had passed away.

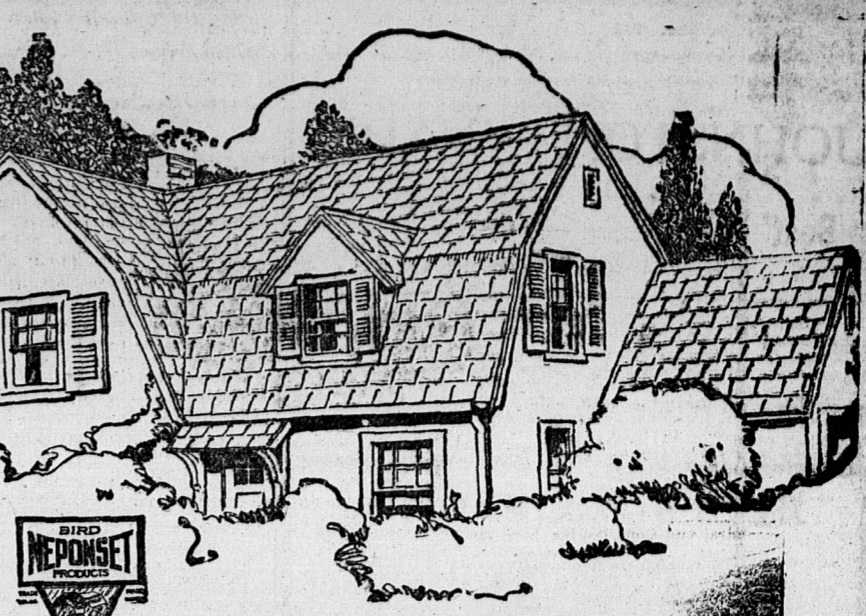

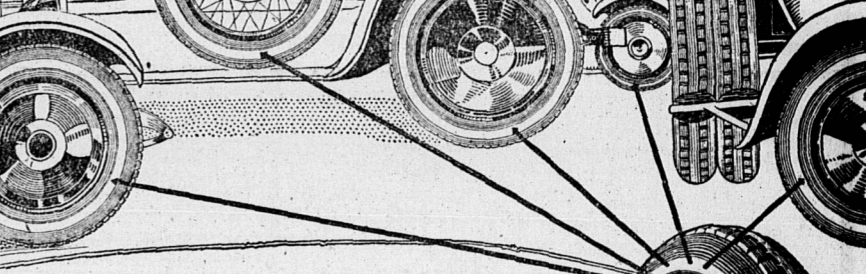
