REGARDING THE CENSUS.

What is leaking out in fragmentary form from Ottawa in regard to the census gives color to the impression that the total population may be found to be disappointing. The population of Ottawa is stated to be 57,778, showing a gain of 13,624 since 1891. From this it would appear that the capital has made a wholesome growth during the decade, although it falls considerably short of the 41 per cent of gain between 1881 and 1891. It had been hoped that Ottawa had now above 60,000 people.

The fullest outline that we have yet seen of the general result is that printed in Le Journal of Montreal in its Ottawa despatch. This may be received with a measure of caution, however, until the official figures are made known, as the Journal being an Opposition paper, can hardly have exclusive sources of information. According to its statement 20 counties in Quebec show a decreased population, while both Ontario and the Maritime Provinces have not kept pace even with Quebec, Ontario probably standing to lose three members and the Maritime Provinces one in consequence. The Journal's statement makes Quebec's present population about 1,800,000 against 1,483,435 ten years ago, a gain of over 300,000. A considerable part of this gain would be in Montreal and other cities and the balance in the 45 counties which are said to show an increase. The gain attributed to Quebec would not be in itself remarkable, but the slower growth credited to Ontario must cause surprise if it should be verified by official statements hereafter.

The esteemed Patriot has now discovered that Premier Farquharson, when passing through Winnipeg was interviewed by the Free Press of that city on the subject of prohibition. It has also learned that the Premier is now on his way home, but apparently did not receive that information in time to correct the opening sentence of its leading article, which implies the contrary.

A member of Hon. Mr. Farquharson's family informs THE GUARDIAN that during his absence letters have been regularly received at intervals of two days. The last letter, received on Monday night was dated at Vancouver, 7th instant. He was then in his usual health. The Ottawa Citizen and Montreal Star of the 13th include the names of Mr. and Mrs. Farquharson among the "recent arrivals" at Banff Hotel. The Patriot says a telegram was received in the city yesterday from Mr. Farquharson dated at Fort William and stating that he and Mrs. Farquharson would spend the day there and will probably reach home next week.

The British Admiralty has done a great work in the past and is still carrying forward marine surveys in the interest of commerce and of all who sail the seas. Just now—from the middle of May past and on to the end of August—one of His Majesty's ships has been and will be engaged in observing the direction and speed of currents on the coast of France and near the Channel Islands. This harmless incident has aroused the fury of some Paris newspaper men who see in it a menace to France. Rochefors and Laurent are angry and virulent. M. De Cassagnac, in Aurorite in milder language says: "In such fashion, an outbreak of war is day by day more probable, and there will not be a corner of our coastlines which is not known, or shore that has not been inspected. It is an unheard of thing that our secular enemy, our eternal enemy, the one that hates us most, and that is ever haunted by the thought of destroying us, should receive from the French Government the mission to accomplish a task which long ago should have been completed only under the special direction of the navy of the republic."
