It was when the Pope was plunged in deep meditation and prayer, and reading the decree of beatification that the apparition appeared.

FINANCE MINISTER IS STILL IN PARIS

PARIS, December 29. — Hon. Mr. Fielding is still here, and for the past ten days he has been in conference with members and officials of the French government in relation to the objections made in the French senate to the Franco-Canadian treaty. Nothing has been made public concerning the negotiations, but the Canadian circle in Paris are hopeful that the difficulties are being overcome, and that the treaty will shortly be approved by the senate.

CHILDREN TAKE FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE

ROCHESTER, December 29. — Ten cases of what is suspected to be the foot and mouth disease, have developed in children of five families in the town of Clarkson, Monroe county, and one of the ten, an infant, has died. The child had symptoms that resembled the disease. The town health officer has sent a report of the suspect in the spread of the disease among the children to Commissioner Porter, of the state department of health.

At the meeting of the Ministerial Association yesterday morning, the following arrangements were made for union services during the Week of Prayer:

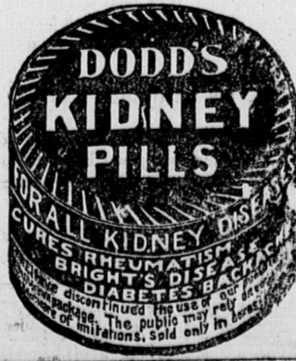
- Monday evening, January 4th.—Grace Church, leader, Rev. T. F. Fullerton; subject, God's Faithfulness and Man's Responsibility.
