INTER-PARLIAMENTARY UNION.

What is called the Inter-Parliamentary Union is made up of various members of the great legislative bodies of the world who are mutually disposed to peace and friendliness, between nations, and meet thus from year to year with those good objects. They also become acquainted with each other and with the feelings and sentiments of other nations than their own. The Union has no legislative powers, but it has excellent intentions and objects and is becoming more and more influential as an exponent of peace and international brotherhood, and more and more of the great public men of the nations are giving in their attention. It is the Parliament of Man in embryo.

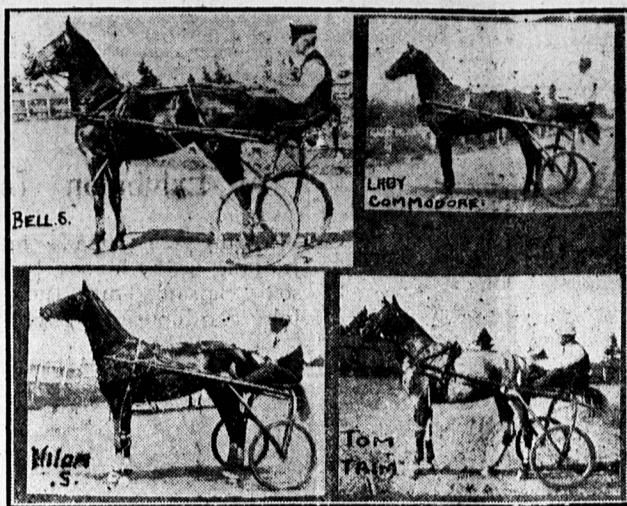
Last spring the inter-Parliamentary Union met in London, where it will be remembered the late British Premier was in attendance and uttered a memorable words, "The Douma is dead Long live the Douma." This was called forth by the presence of representatives of the Russian Parliament for the first time at the Union meetings. The next meeting will be held in Quebec, a high honor to Canada, and another good advertisement as well. Canada is a land of peace and her people are devoted to peace, under free representative Government. In every way the Dominion forms a fitting place for this World's Congress of Parliaments to meet. The occasion promises to be one of prime importance among the events of next year in Canada.

In the Newfoundland election now on upon with Canada is again being put forward as a bugbear. "Bond and Home Rule" is a cry in favor of the Government, and its organ tells that if Sir Edward Morris and the so-called People's Party should come into power, "our prosperity will disappear and we shall become nothing better than a needy hanger-on of the neighboring Dominion of Canada."

The Y. M. C. A. relay race from Summerside to Charlottetown on Tuesday created much interest along the route. Forty boys, each running one mile covered the forty mile course in four hours, nineteen minutes, an average of 6 1/2 minutes to the mile. Some citizens along the route followed the runners for miles. Some of the boys after completing their mile ran two or three miles further for the joy of running. Secretary Archibald informs The Guardian that with some changes the relay race will be made an annual event hereafter.

Having heard Finance Minister Fielding and ex-Finance Minister Foster, our citizens should now be well informed as to the financial affairs of the Dominion. And the people seem to be really interested. In both cases the largest places of meeting available were filled.

The number of forest fires in Canada during the month past has been unprecedented and they have been wide in extent. New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario and other Provinces on the Pacific have all suffered from fires in the woods or on the prairies. These fires occur before the fall of the leaves and while the woods are still green indicate a general period of drought, which has extended over the Dominion and many parts of the States as well. Pastures and crops have suffered too, and wells and streams have gone dry. Through it all our little Province has been greatly favored, and forms a green exception to the widespread droughty conditions elsewhere.

It could have been well if every young man in Prince Edward Island could have heard his cogent reasons for remaining at home. In any case we must his visit and his earnest address will do us good.

EXHIBITION RACES.

There will be two class races held in connection with the King's County Exhibition, on Wednesday, September 30th, 1908. The classes are as follows:—

2.40 Class, Trot and Pace, Purses \$100.00.

2.50 Class, Trot and Pace, Purses \$80.00.

These classes are open to horses owned in King's County for one month previous to the date of the exhibition. Entries close at 8 p. m. Wednesday, September 23rd. Records made at Charlottetown races no bar. All races end at the conclusion of the fifth heat. Money must in every case accompany entry. Entrance fee 5 per cent of purse, and 5 per cent additional tickets from Souris, etc., and other stations at proportionate rates.

Horses to enter and three to start. Hopples not barred. National Rules to govern, except when they conflict with the above conditions. Communications must be addressed to the Secretary.

Excursion return tickets will be issued by regular trains from all stations to Georgetown on One Way First Class Fare, on September 29th and 30th, good to return up to and on Oct 1st, 1908. Tickets at Special Reduced Rates will be issued from Souris, Mount Stewart and intermediate stations to Georgetown on September 30th, good to return on the same day. Return tickets from Souris, etc., and other stations at proportionate rates.

Passengers from Charlottetown, Scotchfort and intermediate stations may obtain tickets at the reduced rates, and go by regular morning train on same day, or follow by morning train. Tickets are good only for continuous journey in either direction. Returning special train will leave Georgetown for Souris at 6.30 p. m.
