**ANOTHER ISLANDER WINS MEDAL.**—Gunner Oliver Wendall Holmes, of Broderick, Sask., one of the first men of the town to volunteer for service overseas, has been awarded the Military Medal for conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty. According to the official record, Gunner McRae, in August of last year, acted as lines man for telephone work. "He worked through the day," says the official record, "at repairing lines. His work was carried out under particularly heavy shelling, rifle and machine gun fire." Gunner McRae is well known in Broderick and district—Sask. ex (Gunner McRae above referred to is a son of the late John McRae of Rice Point.)

**MILTON ORANGEMEN.**—At a meeting of the L. O. L. Barton, Milton, P. E. I., Rev. Bro. B. P. Colclough, R. W. G. C., moved, and Bro. C. E. McKenzie, R. W. G. Cherishing, as we do, the motto of "Equal Rights for all, and special privileges for none," we feel we owe a debt of gratitude to the Protestant Ministers of Guelph for the firm and reasonable stand they have taken, and desire to express our determination to give them all the moral and material support in our power to press upon the Government of today the absolute necessity of an official enquiry at which the Ministerial Association shall be legally represented. Also, that a copy of this resolution be sent to Hon. C. J. Doherty, Minister of Justice, Hon. S. C. Mewburn, Minister of Militia, and the Prime Minister of Canada, Sir R. L. Borden; and that copies be sent to the local press and The Sentinel."

**DEMONSTRATION IN CANNING**

A most interesting Canning Demonstration was given yesterday afternoon in the Household Science Kitchen, under the direction of the Women's Institute Branch. About fifty of the Charlottetown ladies attended and all declared themselves well pleased with the valuable information which they received.

The necessity of canning home grown fruits and vegetables for the winter's use was first dealt with. At the present time almost every home has a small garden of some kind, from which a sufficient amount of canned goods could be obtained to supply the needs of the family for the year. The canning process is not at all a difficult one, and it is quite possible for any house keeper to carry on a canning factory on a small scale in her own home. An expensive or a specially made equipment is not at all needed. This fact was proved yesterday when only the simplest of equipment was used in the Demonstration. Complete sterilization is the main secret in connection with successful canning. Thorough sterilization of the jars and the product to be canned is very essential as is also the cleanliness of all cooking utensils.

The different methods of canning fruits, vegetables and meats were fully explained and the canning of peas, beans, cauliflower, rhubarb, strawberries, plums, and chicken was demonstrated; also the care and storage of the canned products.

At the close of the Demonstration, bulletins dealing with Home Canning were distributed and a number of the War Recipe Books of the Canada Food Board were sold.
