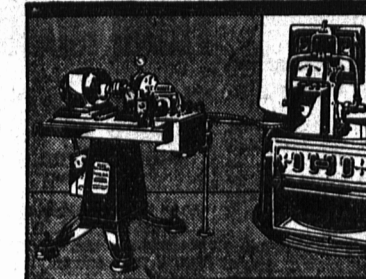

Gov. Ely Through With Politics

(A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) BOSTON, Sept. 29-Governor Joseph B. Ely says he is "through with politics."

The governor made his emphatic statement as he left for the ancient and honorable field day at Ottawa. He had been asked whether or not he would aid the campaign of James M. Curley, Democratic nominee for governor, when he returned from the Canadian capital. The three-day trip is purely for pleasure, the governor said, and added that he would try to forget the cares of state during his visit. "It looks like I was through some time ago," Governor Ely said in reiterating his determination to quit the political field.

Hitler Boycotts German Hospital

(A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) BERLIN, Oct. 1-Drastic punishment for not voting for Adolf Hitler as Reichfuhrer Aug. 19 is being visited upon an entire Dusseldorf hospital.

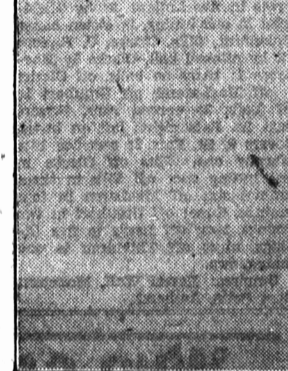
According to the newspaper Reichswart, the editor of which is Count Ernst Von Reventlow, one of Hitler's oldest associates, physicians have been ordered to boycott the hospital. The newspaper said the following letter, signed by Dr. Soller, the Nazi president of the Dusseldorf Medical Association, has been circulated. "St. Mary's Hospital repudiated Der Fuehrer and National Social-

ism by a vote of more than 50 percent. This is a provocation not only against the medical profession and the city but also against the government. The Dusseldorf Medical Association will try to make amends for this show of alien spirit by barring this hospital until its business is ruined.

"I decree that assigning patients to St. Mary's Hospital is strictly forbidden. The names of German doctors acting contrary to this order will be published."

Meanwhile the newspaper Angriff, with an editorial entitled "The Marooned," asked Nazis to forget the past and make friends with their former political opponents many of whom, it said, were being ridiculed and discriminated against despite their silent approbation of Reichsfuehrer Hitler.

REHEARSING FOR FLIGHT WHICH ENDED IN TRAGEDY AND ILL-LUCK

When this picture was taken, Sir Alan Cobham, famous British airman, and Squadron Leader Holmore, were rehearsing for the great refueling flight to "India and back in four days." When the flight actually started the big plane at the top of the picture crashed after the refueling of the "Airspeed Courier" and the four occupants of the machine were killed. Cobham continued his flight and after two refuelings in the air was forced to land at Malta 1,800 miles away from the start, with a broken throttle control.

POLICE CONDUCT SEARCH
