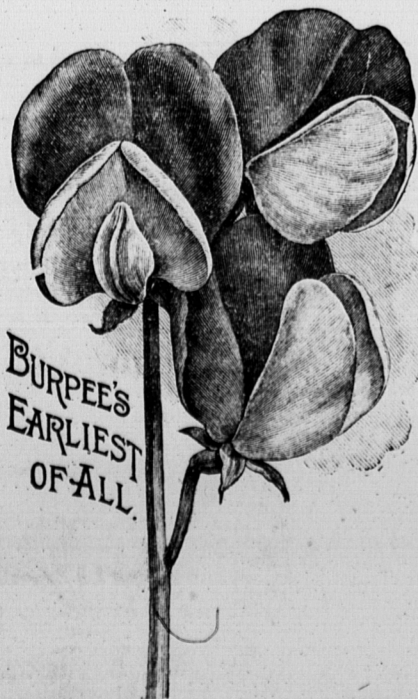

coat.

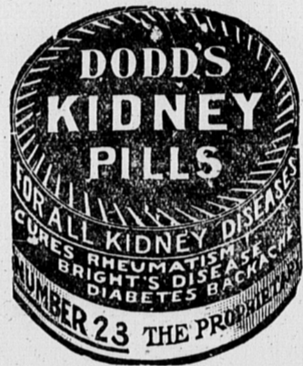
That's out o' keepin', I will admit,

A TORNADO STRIKES

PAULSVALLEY, Okla., May 21—Marysville, a small town, fifteen miles northwest of here, was wiped off the map by a tornado, and several persons were killed, according to meagre reports received. The town of McCarthy near Marysville was also nearly all swept away and three persons were killed.

THE KING'S FUNERAL

LONDON, May 21—Messages from all parts of the world show that yesterday was devoted to universal mourning for King Edward.

Throughout South Africa most solemn memorial services were held attended by vast congregations amid scenes of heartfelt sorrow. Hundreds of magnificent wreaths were deposited at the statue of the dead King, at Cape Town.

Funeral services were held throughout India, the Hindus joining in them in a remarkable manner. All military trains were halted for fifteen minutes.

The Governor General and all the officials of the Federate States assembled on the steps of the Parliament buildings in Melbourne, in the presence of the most solemn assembly ever gathered together in Australia marking the solemnity of the passing King by a long space of reverent silence. They then sang the National Anthem. The day was observed as a day of mourning in Sydney, the bells being tolled from noon to sunset, when a salute of sixty-eight minute guns was fired.

In the afternoon 100,000 persons attended a memorial service in Centennial Park, Wellington, New Zealand.
