**LIFE AT BRAMSHOT ENJOYED BY THE BOYS**

The following letter was received by Mr. Michael McDonald, Ebenezer, from his brother A. McDonald who enlisted in Vancouver:  
 March 7, 1916, Pte. A. McDonald, CG-629887 47th. Batt. C. E. F., Army P. O., London, Eng.  
 Dear Brother:-  
 I just was thinking of home and my boyhood days this morning so I dropped down on my bed and am writing a few lines to let you know that I am well and having a pretty good time of it as yet.  
 We are camped in Bramshot camp just forty miles from London. There is a lot of soldiers in this camp—about twenty thousand.  
 They keep going and coming all the time. There is quite a lot of sickness, nasty measles, but I have been pretty lucky so far and have escaped every-

thing. The huts are very comfortable, new and very well built. The weather has been very wet but now we are having a cold snap and a little snow. It is snowing hard today and if it keeps on till night it will make sleighing.  
 I must tell you about London. I was to see the big City—had a six days pass. It is certainly some city. Just you imagine! It is 30 miles wide and 40 miles long with as many people as all of Canada and soldiers there are like the sand on the shore. When the Pubs opened they take the place by storm. It looks very strange to us Canadians but I must say they treat us very nicely.  
 What do you think about the old war? It is terrible isn't it. I might say we are only about one days journey from the trenches so it won't be far to go when we get the word, and strange to say everybody seems anxious.  
 Well Dear Brother must come to a close. I understand you have sons in the army. Let me know where they

are and I will try to find them. When in Alberta, I was sorry I had not met you.  
 Give my best wishes to all not forgetting yourself and your wife and family.
