Britain To Retain Million Under Arms

England Digs Out After Snow Storm

Indignation at the action of the Federal authorities in prohibiting exportation of Island table stock potatoes to Newfoundland was voiced by several members of the Legislature yesterday. The question was raised in the House by Mr. George E. Saville, Fifth King, who called attention to the prohibitory order. It applies to Newfoundland, but not to St. Pierre, and it is to be in force for six months. Mr. Saville contrasted the importance of the Newfoundland market with that of St. Pierre, and said the order might have a serious effect on Island potato trade.

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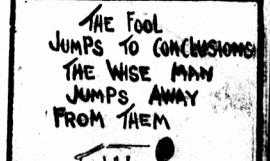

HALIFAX, March 4.—(CP)—Following is the official weather synopsis at 8:30 P.M. Monday, March 4:

The mid spring weather which favoured the Maritimes today will continue through Tuesday with clear skies and slightly lower temperatures. Winds are moderate westerly with the exception of the Gulf of St. Lawrence and Anticosti areas, which are still experiencing strong westerly winds due to a storm centered off the Labrador coast. Winds will slowly decrease in all areas during the next 36 hours.
