Councilman Michael Sullivan said he had halted a group of marching students and asked to see their permit to parade when he was suddenly 'rushed' from the scene.

Members of the Lampon, undergraduate fun-making publication, were goose-stepping around the yard in blue shirts, riding breeches and Sam Brown belts, when a general melee started.

Fellow students bombarded the Lampon boys with eggs as, waving multi-hued flags, they marched past a trench dug for water pipes.

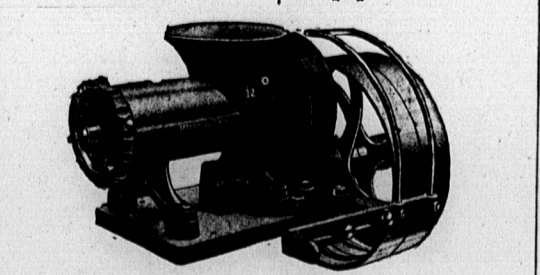
