A disarming and adorable smile and a will which used in the right time and fashion should be a remarkable asset, withstood our wiles until a better interest beckoned her. Either one of us might have changed her mind if James had not been so near. From his choring nearby he could keep in touch with the situation. Evidently suspecting a threat in Jeanie's attitude, he called in a voice which carried me back to other child rearing: "Aw, let the poor little thing stay there, if she wants to!"

So many ways, and widely different, have been offered through the years by those who have made a study of child rearing it is a blessing that mothers as a rule are endowed with special knowledge on the subject, which they learned instinctively on hearing their first child's cry. Though not always can they make theory and practice agree. A time there was when the babe's physical well-being was considered above everything. He was treated in an impersonal manner, cared for "by the clock," in much the manner that James attends to the youngest calf or Jock to his weanlings in the pigery — and there was some disappointment over the outcome. Now, as fashions in women's dress seek to swing back to the styles of many decades past, when living was more serene and certainly more gracious and secure, so methods of child-rearing appear to be following a like trend or so we read in an article which interested Jeanie and me of late. Thus it is, that not only the mother but both parents and child get the best benefits that the partnership affords.

**LOBSTER CATCHES IMPROVED** — While the lobster catches so far this season are poorer from Alberton to North Cape than they were for the same period last season, the catches off French River and Rustico are much better, according to Mr. J. J. Larabee, supervisor Dominion Department of Fisheries, Charlottetown. Mr. Larabee said yesterday that very little if any poaching was carried on last year at either Rustico or French River and that he attributes the increase in the catches this spring at those places to that fact.

**HALIFAX, May 17** — Over 1,000 members of RCAC, RCA, RCE and RC Signals Reserve Force units from the Maritime Provinces will embark on a summer training program at three camps in Ontario this year, it was announced today by headquarters, Eastern Army Command.
