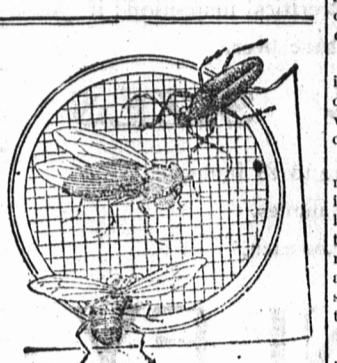

Rev. Thos. Bates, who is to take charge of Central Christian Church, Summerside, arrived by the Northumberland Saturday evening and preached his first sermon to that congregation yesterday. At ten years of age he, with his father, emigrated to Adelaide, Australia. Here he served his apprenticeship to the printing trade. At the age of twenty-two he formed a resolution to study for the ministry. There being no institution of learning affiliated with the Christian Church he came to America and on his way he visited his native land, being 17 days from Adelaide to London. Arriving in America he studied four years in the University of Kentucky, graduating from the same college as Rev. J. F. Floyd, the pastor of Coburg street church here. On the completion of his studies he went back to Australia by way of San Francisco, calling at Honolulu, Samoa and others of the Islands of the Pacific group. He was on his way west when Rev. Mr. Floyd informed him of the vacancy in Summerside.

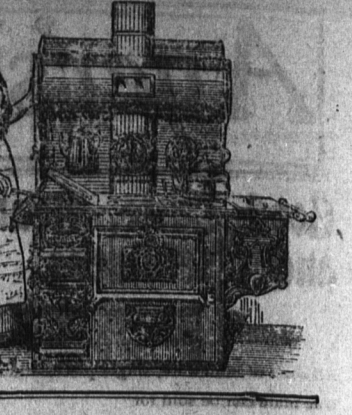
