MALAGASH SILVER BLACK FOX CO.

A very interesting Fox Company is the Malagash Silver Fox Co., of Malagash, Nova Scotia. It has never printed a prospectus or sent out any information and it has no stock for sale. It was formed over a year ago when the foxes on the ranch of W. E. Teed's farm at Malagash were put in with some Boston capital and a \$100,000 Company formed.

Herbert J. Larkin of Alberton, now of Amherst, N. S. together with other members of his family and W. E. Teed his brother-in-law had been active with foxes for two or three seasons. They have a very large interest in the Company which was incorporated under Massachusetts laws and was also registered with the Provincial Government at Halifax.

Five litters are already assured this year from their old breeders and some 1913 pups are still to be heard from. A generous dividend is assured. This Company is a "family affair," the only other parties largely interested being in the States, N. F. VanHorsen of Cambridge, Mass., who is the chief stock holder, Mr. VanHorsen is also the President and Treasurer of the Company. A short time ago he interested Mr. Ernest Thompson Seton in the Company and Mr. Seton is now an active partner and shareholder. Mr. Seton has an international reputation as an author, scout and naturalist. He is at the head of the great Boy Scout Movement in the United States, an active contributor to the magazine, "Boys Life" and the author of many animal and nature stories.

His interest is largely in the animal themselves. The fox is one of his old friends and he has been planning for several years to include a few foxes in his fur farm at Greenwich, Connecticut, near one hundred stunks, bob-cats, mink, otter, martens, etc. He is erecting pens and will have some of the Malagash foxes on exhibition in a few weeks. This will be a veritable "show window" for New York people. In the fox line, his estate comprises over ninety acres in the hilly slopes adjacent to the Whitney and Wm. Rockefeller estates. Here, camp the older boys of the Scout movement, the Camp Fire Club of New York and other sportsmen. This will be a choice way to interest New York capital in the fox industry as the industry is but an hours drive by auto from the City. Cards of invitation will be issued and those fortunate enough to secure these will find a delightful taste and choice animals on exhibit. Mr. Seton receives hundreds of letters of inquiry relative to foxes and the fox industry and has heretofore refused many offers from companies seeking to have him join them. He is interested in the fox itself from a scientific standpoint and expects to contribute his expert assistance to the industry in general. A niece to the Malagash Silver Fox Co., is the Boston Silver Black Fox Co. Some of the same parties control the stock of both companies and these Companies will work together in harmony. The Boston S. B. Fox Co. has issued a very tastefully arranged pamphlet which Ernest Thompson Seton thinks of the fox industry. These may be secured from Mr. VanHorsen, Cambridge, Mass.
