FIFTIETH ANNUAL REPORT

For The Year 1942

The fourth war-time annual report of The Eastern Trust Company was presented to the shareholders at the annual general meeting on February 17th. Despite the difficulties of the times, further progress in the Company's affairs during 1942 was revealed. Net earnings amount to \$141,740.78, which represents an increase of \$1,986.38 over the preceding year.

Estates, Trusts and Agencies under administration by the Company increased to \$59,006,423.57—an increase of \$606,619.95. A favorable balance of \$27,260.29, compared with \$26,949.34 in 1941, was carried forward to Profit and Loss, after providing for the highest taxes in the Company's history, depreciation, and the regular dividends. The Reserve Fund is maintained at \$350,000.

MRS. MARY RICHARDS BUELL

The death took place at White Sands, Kings County on Tuesday, Jan. 26th, 1943, of Mary Richards Buell, wife of Mr. Mack Buell at the age of 45 years.

The late Mrs. Buell was born in Abing, Kings County and taught school 12 years. Among the school districts in which she taught and will be remembered may be mentioned Gladstone, Amundale, High Bank, Abney, Hopefield, Iris. Her death was quite unexpected. Taking sick at her work in school she died six days later.

She leaves to mourn besides her sorrowing husband her only brother, Chas. F. Richards of Abney, also two half-brothers and two half-sisters, William and James White Richards of Abney, Mrs. Hanford Bell of Murrey Harbour and Miss Annie White of Providence, Rhode Island. Her parents, one brother and sister.

Her funeral which was largely attended was held from her home at White Sands. The Rev. W. C. Picketts conducted the service. The hymns sung were: My Faith Looks Up To Thee, Shall We Gather At the River, Safe In The Arms of Jesus and Jesus Saviour Pilot Me. The Pallbearers were: Lemuel Buell, Harry Clements, Bob MacFarlane and Stewart Clements. The Hearse driver was Vere Phillips. The remains were tenderly laid to rest in the Murrey Harbour Cemetery.
