Rumor heard Anglo-Italian Armistice soon

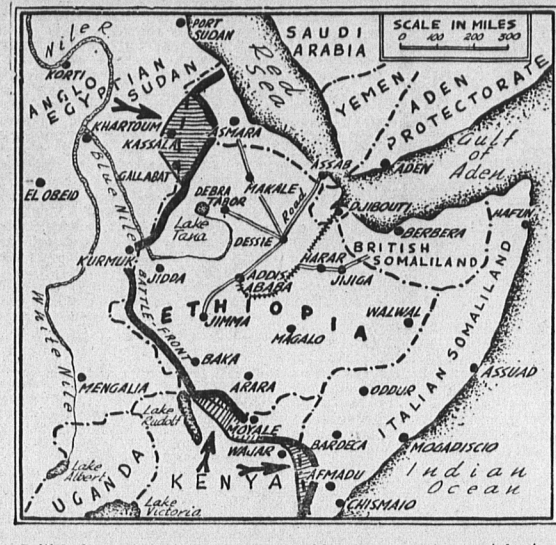
